



This week, Principal Poppy sent a school wide email to address some concerning behaviors that have been emerging in our school recently. As you know, our goal is to create a safe, respectful, and supportive environment where every student feels valued and can thrive. However, we've noticed a few troubling patterns that need our collective attention.

Here is what we are seeing in first grade:

Bullying and Harassment (Grades K-5)

There have been several instances of bullying and harassment, including negative comments directed at peers. Some students have been making hurtful remarks, engaging in name-calling, or using physical contact such as poking and pushing. These

behaviors are not acceptable and can make others feel uncomfortable, unsafe, or targeted.

Off-Task and Disrespectful Behavior (Grades K-5)

Additionally, we have seen an increase in off-task behavior during lessons, which can disrupt the learning environment for others. Students are also engaging in inappropriate jokes—such as roasts or "burns"—that target others in hurtful ways. These comments and behaviors are not in line with the respectful culture we are trying to build.

Students Feeling Targeted (Grades K-5)

Some students have expressed feeling targeted or uncomfortable due to the behavior of their peers. It's important that we all work together to ensure that every child feels respected, safe, and heard.

How You Can Help

We encourage you to have conversations with your child about the importance of respect and kindness, both in and outside of school. Please remind them that their words and actions have a significant impact on others, and that bullying, racism, sexism, or any form of disrespect will not be tolerated. 

With the partnership of 4J Safe Routes to School program, Kindergarteners and 1st graders will soon be learning and practicing riding bicycles during PE. This week, Principal Poppy sent a school wide email to address some concerning behaviors that have been emerging in our school recently. As you know, our goal is to create a safe, respectful, and supportive environment where every student feels valued and can thrive. However, we've noticed a few troubling patterns that need our collective attention.

Here is what we are seeing in first grade:

Bullying and Harassment (Grades K-5)

There have been several instances of bullying and harassment, including negative comments directed at peers. Some students have been making hurtful remarks, engaging in name-calling, or using physical contact such as poking and pushing. These behaviors are not acceptable and can make others feel uncomfortable, unsafe, or targeted.

Off-Task and Disrespectful Behavior (Grades K-5)

Additionally, we have seen an increase in off-task behavior during lessons, which can disrupt the learning environment for others. Students are also engaging in inappropriate jokes—such as roasts or "burns"—that target others in hurtful ways. These comments and behaviors are not in line with the respectful culture we are trying to build.

Students Feeling Targeted (Grades K-5)

Some students have expressed feeling targeted or uncomfortable due to the behavior of their peers. It's important that we all work together to ensure that every child feels respected, safe, and heard.

What We're Doing

As part of our efforts to address these concerns, we are reinforcing our classroom expectations, which emphasize kindness, respect, and responsibility. We are also having discussions around empathy, conflict resolution, hidden disabilities, and the importance of treating everyone with dignity. We are actively working with students to address specific incidents, and will continue to monitor the situation closely. Students have received direct instruction related to the difference between tattling and reporting and we are encouraging students to speak up if they observe or experience unsafe/unkind behavior from their peers.

How You Can Help

We encourage you to have conversations with your child about the importance of respect and kindness, both in and outside of school. Please remind them that their words and actions have a significant impact on others, and that bullying, racism, sexism, or any form of disrespect will not be tolerated. 
