Rational of the Post Distribution Monitoring

As the distribution of the proposed female dignity kits distribution has successfully completed, it is important to conduct a PDM assessment to verify the actual beneficiaries have received the dignity kits as per the planned. To achieve this objective data will be collected from clients to measure the effects of the intervention. Hence, this Terms of Reference (TOR) summarizes the proposed activities to cascade PDM.

General Objective

The PDM principally aims to assess the effectiveness of the dignity kit distribution to women and girls in the project area.

The Specific objectives of the PDM:

- To assess the timeliness, effectiveness and efficiency of the distribution
- To verify receipt of correct type and amounts of dignity kits by women and girls
- To understand how the dignity kits are being used by beneficiaries
- Evaluate overall satisfaction of the dignity kit distribution from the perspective of beneficiaries
- Monitor protection risks related to distribution of dignity kits
- Utilize the information to improve future distributions and overall program quality for similar projects.

Methodology

Target Population

The survey will be conducted on the targeted households in Erebti and Berhale Woreda of Afar region where distribution has been conducted.

Sampling Techniques

The PDM will be conducted through household surveys. Primary data will be collected using the household level questionnaire designed for post distribution monitoring interview. The survey will consider representative samples from all distribution sites in Erebti and Berhale. Simple random sampling technique will be used to select beneficiaries from the beneficiary list. Adequate and representative sample size that enables statistically valid conclusions will be selected in accordance with the protection and GBV AoR cluster in recommendation and guideline for conducting PDM.

conducting field-based survey, research, monitoring, analysis and reporting, preferably in
emergency projects.
Personnel with knowledge of local culture and languages /Qafar/ that spoken by the
different communities, government counterparts and implementing partners
ASDEPO prefers a team of enumerators consultancy firm that should possess minimum
qualifications and provide references
As a team leader of the PDM the personnel must have a University degree preferably in
social sciences, research methods, administration
Monitors engaged for this assignment should have at least three years' experience in
reviewing and monitoring humanitarian projects specially in Protection.
