### **Final Paper: March 15th, 2016**


We have been learning about famous people in history. We are turning this learning experience into a wax museum project for the entire fifth grade. Each student will begin the steps to get ready for this wonderful 5th grade experience this week!

All of our students have chosen a person to research. We have already started reading our books and taking notes about their person's life; keeping in mind, they will need to look for and record the facts, details, and timeframes for each category of information for their biography report .

Although most of their research will be done in class, some of the project will need to be done at home. Their HOME responsibilities will include gathering a costume, finding artifacts to help tell "their" story, and making a tri-fold poster at home. (Tri-fold posters can be bought at Rite Aid, Wal Mart Mardens or Dollar Tree, or the students can re-do an older siblings tri-fold)

For this Wax Museum project, students will be able to:

- Research and summarize notes for a written report.
- Determine and translate, in their own language, the main ideas and supporting details of their character's contribution to history.
- Write a grammatically correct, organized, fluent, and detailed biography.
- Describe the connections between two or more people, events, ideas or concepts in a historical, scientific, "how to", text by using text to support their findings.
- Create a timeline of events of their person's life.
- Gather a **costume and props** with accurate attention to details.
- Design an informative, visually appealing, and interactive tri-fold.
- Write and include a bibliography with their final research paper.
