SCOUTING REPORTS:

#1. (WR) Dustin Bailey [6'5 233] [Michigan] [PROJECTED #1]

Usually, a Receiver doesn't get projected #1 Overall, but the answer is extremely clear. Dustin Bailey is tall, fast and wins almost every jump ball that his quarterback throws at him. Every single game post his Freshman season, he has been double covered or even tripled, that's how dominant this guy was. Scouts compare him to Calvin Johnson Jr and Randy Moss, people believe he is going to be the one to break Jerry Rice's records.

Comparison: Calvin Johnson Jr [CEILING] | Alshon Jeffrey [FLOOR]

#2. (LOLB) Ryn Rose [6'2 241] [Oregon] [PROJECTED TOP 3]

Despite Oregon losing their star offensive players, Ryn Rose has popped out this year leading the entire nation in Sacks, TFLs and Tackles. This feat alone could've put him into the Top 3, however people think that Ryn Rose could run a mid 4.4 40 yard dash and that'll make him absolutely lethal against NFL offenses. Coaches also report, he has a list of quarterbacks he would like to sack including Mahomes, Jackson, J. Washington and K. Kitchens.

#3. (RT) Will Dunn [6'7 336] [Ohio State] [PROJECTED TOP 3]

Massive Offensive Lineman, he gained a couple pounds while his time at Ohio State, but these are pounds of muscle. He lost a lot of his fat training his ass off over the three seasons and it completely paid off, absolutely manhandling all incoming defensive ends including **Alex McCallum**. There aren't many flaws to this guys game except his agility. If he keeps his work ethic the same, he will be a long term pro bowl lineman.

#4. (CB) Matthew Henry [6'2 190] [Florida] [PROJECTED TOP 10]

After Raq Charles went down, everyone started to take notice of Matthew Henry. He was lethal at Florida breaking up passes all over the SEC. Scouts were right, Matthew Henry is most definitely going to be the next Deion Sanders. The ball hawk skill and the elite man to man coverage as well as great zone reads. He has everything you would want in a Cornerback, he was so good that nobody wanted to throw on him this season. Hence why his partner Kelvin Coleman won the Thorpe award this year. Couldn't guard Dustin Bailey 1v1 though...

Comparison: Xavien Howard [CEILING] | Malcolm Butler [FLOOR]

#5. (MLB) Paranoia Patterson [6'2 245] [Georgia] [PROJECTED TOP 10]

This guy has to be the scariest person in college football. Fans remember this one moment this season him going head to head against Freshman monster Anthony Anderson, who is 3 inches taller, and still laid him out forcing a fumble against Alabama. Anderson was walked off, but Paranoia definitely scares any running back out the back field. The main concern with Patterson is his pass coverage skills. The only times he's gotten an interception in his career are when the receiver drops it or the ball gets tipped up.

Comparison: Luke Kuechly [CEILING] | Jarrad Davis [FLOOR]

#6. (WR) Eric Jones [6'2 193] [Arizona State] [PROJECTED TOP 10]

The standout star for the Sun Devils for the past 3 seasons. He has never missed a single game in his college career. Led the NCAA his Freshman season in receiving yards and in his Sophomore season he came second to only Dustin Bailey. Due to a switch from Washington to Charlton his performance plummeted slightly. But you know what didn't regress? His speed, absolute burner and scouts project him to break the 40 yard dash record time.

Comparison: Tyreek Hill [CEILING] | John Ross [FLOOR]

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 69 Receptions, 1143 Yards, 11 TDs

#7. (LE) James Webster [6'3 255] [Florida] [PROJECTED TOP 10]

Was projected as a late second round draft pick before he had an insane stretch of games from the SEC Championship and the BCS Playoffs as well as an incredible showing at his pro day. Webster showing up at the biggest stage has helped him achieve top ten status, although fans aren't quite convinced that he's an elite defensive end. He is incredibly professional compared to Javier Sapien the former starting LE for the Gators.

Comparison: Demarcus Lawrence [CEILING] | Derek Barnett [FLOOR]

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 3 FFs, 11 Sacks, 19 TFLs, 94 Tackles

#8. (QB) Chris Turner [6'2 224] [Texas] [PROJECTED TOP 10]

The former top high school recruit committed to his home state and turned Texas football into what it once was, however he's never won a Bowl game or BCS game in his college career. His loss against the Florida Gators dropped him from being a top three pick. Scouts are worried that he isn't ready for NFL defenses. His throwing mechanic and accuracy is flawless. But his ability to read defenses still isn't quite there to many scouts' eyes.

Comparison: Philip Rivers [CEILING] | Dwayne Haskins [FLOOR]

#9. (TE) Wesley Green [6'6 260] [Ohio State] [PROJECTED TOP 10]

Back to Back Mackey Winner, would've been a 3x winner if Darius Mason didn't have such a good year for Florida. Wesley Green isn't a basketball player like prior top ten TEs, but he sure has amazing hands and run blocking. The combination of these skills made him into a super elite tight end for Ohio State. There is only one thing that separates him from Darius Mason and other TEs, his ability to run routes aren't there. Ohio State only taught him to do streaks, posts and drags. I feel like at the next level he should be able to do more than just that.

Comparison: Travis Kelce [CEILING] | Vance McDonald [FLOOR]

#10. (HB) Jacob Marmo [5'11 217] [Duke] [PROJECTED TOP 10]

The controversial Heisman Winner from Duke, people both believe he deserved it for carrying Duke through three seasons with 9 or 10 wins. But other people say that's all Duke did, run the ball down the throats of their opponents. Regardless of how you stand on Marmo, he is one of the strongest runners in the entire class, Not only this but he is also a proven pass blocker for the Blue Devils as well. Can't wait to see him in the NFL.

Comparison: Nick Chubb [CEILING] | Rex Burkhead [FLOOR]

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 324 Attempts, 2048 Yards, 25 TDs & 11 Receptions, 57 Yards

#11. (CB) Kelvin Coleman [6'1 188] [Florida] [PROJECTED TOP 20]

The other part of the tyrannical Florida secondary, he won the Thorpe award this season because of opposing quarterbacks being too scared to throw it on Matthew Henry. He was looking like a receiver on the defense with how many interceptions he got. Kelvin Coleman is considered to be a faster but less skilled defender than Henry. Just imagine these two on the same team in the NFL, you're absolutely set for DBs.

Comparison: Marcus Peters [CEILING] | Vernon Hargreaves II [FLOOR]

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 10 INTs, 2 TFL, 65 Tackles, 9 PBUs, 2 TDs

#12. (HB) Dustin McDougal [5'10 195] [Penn State] [PROJECTED TOP 20]

One of the fastest men in college football, right up there with Eric Jones is Dustin McDougal. He was runner up for the Heisman Trophy a season before this, he could've won it this season but Penn State implemented the option offense with Freshman QB **Demetrius Coles** and took the Big 10 by storm, the only team to ever stop this offense was Michigan, Ohio State could not keep up and got slaughtered by the Option 45-21. With split carries between him and Coles, he couldn't compile enough stats to run for any awards.

Comparison: Chris Johnson [CEILING] | Dri Archer [FLOOR]

#13. (RG) Brock Horne [6'5 304] [Michigan] [PROJECTED TOP 20]

"The Karate Kid" known for demolishing defensive linemen with his amazing hand work that he deems was from participating in Karate since he was in the 8th grade. Brock Horne is a black belt and he says that if the NFL doesn't work out for him, he will be applying to fight in the MMA, I can't tell which I would want more, seeing Brock Horne on Sundays flinging defensive linemen or him on Saturdays delivering a head kick to Heavyweights. Horne is a great all-around blocker, but his pass blocking is regarded as the best in this class.

Comparison: Brandon Scherff [CEILING] | Will Hernandez [FLOOR]

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 46 Pancakes, 3 Sacks Allowed

#14. (MLB) Leonard Drew [6'0 239] [Washington] [PROJECTED TOP 20]

Leonard Drew was considered to be an average linebacker in the Pac 12 until he showed up to play against Arizona State being able to keep up with Eric Jones speed, although being unable to tackle him it was impressive regardless. People started to pay attention to Drew as he followed up with an interception every week since that game. His 40 time was hidden from everyone during his pro days, electing to run it during the combine only.

Comparison: Deion Jones [CEILING] | Raekwon McMillian [FLOOR]

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 1 FF, 5 INTs, 9 TFLs, 98 Tackles, 11 PBU

#15. (FS) Jarod King [6'1 227] [Louisville] [PROJECTED TOP 20]

Many people widely think that Jarod King is an overrated player for Louisville, but a great showing in the Senior Bowl & Pro Day bumped him up from a mid second to mid first round. Jarod King just seemed to be there at the right time for the Cardinals, his coverage was often exposed during his time at Louisville, but when the ball was thrown in his proximity he made the play. I feel like with a little more awareness he'll be a NFL Caliber safety.

Comparison: Adrian Amos [CEILING] | Taylor Rapps [FLOOR]

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 4 INTs, 5 TFLs, 72 Tackles, 16 PBU

#16. (LG) Marcus Pearson [6'4 290] [Florida] [PROJECTED TOP 20]

Surprisingly agile for a Lineman, he has demonstrated some real good hustle switching between blocking a DT to setting up an opening for the Florida QB to duck through. Although it took Levine a while to adjust, Walker was quite fantastic at this aspect when playing for Florida allowing for Pearson to let up 0 sacks. This season due to QB adjustment let up a couple of errors but he finished his season strong allowing nothing in the second half of Florida's season.

Comparison: Ali Marpet [CEILING] | Bench [FLOOR]

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 27 Pancakes, 4 Sacks Allowed

#17. (QB) EJ Bryant [6'3 221] [Oklahoma] [PROJECTED TOP 20]

Rival of Chris Turner, EJ Bryant originally flipped from Florida Gators to chase down Turner into his own college division to play him. Due to Oklahoma's lack of offensive weapons he wasn't able to beat Texas in some outings, but he was always close and kept the games competitive. Overall, he's led Oklahoma to a top 10 ranking, he looked spectacular in his bowl game against Notre Dame. Throwing for 5 TDs and 350 yards, Seth Hinds said he was the hardest quarterback to stop because of his play creating after the pocket collapses.

Comparison: Carson Wentz 2017 [CEILING] | Carson Wentz 2020 [FLOOR]

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 4065 Yards, 37 TDs, 6 INTs & 291 Rushing, 2 TDs

#18. (RE) Sean Hughes [6'2 237] [Oregon] [PROJECTED FIRST ROUND]

Gained some weight for Oregon, still kept his speed from High School, but Oregon utilized him as a linebacker to partner with Ryn Rose. Overall though, His speed is what makes him so dangerous. He was easily stopped if he was caught by an offensive lineman, but when he wasn't blocked off the blitz he got the quarterback nearly instantly. Scrambling QBs couldn't escape this man.

Comparison: TJ Watt [CEILING] | Bench [FLOOR]

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 1 FF, 6.5 Sacks, 8 TFLs, 49 Tackles

#19. (WR) Jaymond Johnson [6'3 226] [Alabama] [PROJECTED SECOND ROUND]

He hasn't been talked about much due to the likes of star receivers like Travis Wade, Dustin Bailey or Eric Jones but Jaymond Johnson has been an absolute threat for the Crimson Tide. Since Clearglass and Kahala Iousa's departure he's been Alabama's WR #1 and people see him as a Julio Jones Clone. Amazing ability to turn short passes into massive gains and led the nation in most run after catch yardage. His jump ball ability is pretty solid, it's not Dustin Bailey level but he has caught a pass over two defenders once.

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 91 Receptions, 1225 Yards, 7 TDs

#20. (RG) Connor Dodds [6'2 311] [UCLA] [PROJECTED SECOND ROUND]

Everyone was unsure why he won the Outland Trophy over many other people, but they all agreed he was one of the most underrated players in the Pac 12. Not to the point he should've won the Outland but he was blocking for one of the worst offensive teams in the Pac 12. Scouts project that his skill set will land him a starting job in the NFL day one. Experts believe that he's going to fall to the middle of the second but experts have him in the late first.

#21. (DT) Blake Williams [6'4 332] [Clemson] [PROJECTED SECOND ROUND]

Big and Punishing DT for Clemson has been quiet for most of this season, but for the past few seasons he has had double digit sack numbers. The main concern is his ability to shed blocks, every time he's played a top tier offensive line, he wasn't able to shed through the line to make any impact. I believe he should stay back for another season to develop his skill set but his raw strength is hard to pass up on.

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 3 FFs, 8.5 Sacks, 14 TFL, 64 Tackles

#22. (QB) Marcus Kaplan [6'2 203] [Florida State] [PROJECTED SECOND ROUND]

You might know him as the Quarterback to get absolutely blown out by Michigan a year ago in the semi-finals of the BCS Playoffs. But despite him not being able to score against Michigan, he has only lost a total of 3 games as a starter which is pretty impressive. He started out as a run first quarterback, but overtime he progressed his accuracy and became a threat both through the air and the ground. Will he continue to improve going into the NFL?

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 3328 Yards, 31 TDs, 6 INTs & 971 Rushing, 11 TDs

#23. (HB) Calvin Crawford [6'1 235] [Michigan] [PROJECTED THIRD ROUND]

Calvin Crawford isn't known for being a really good halfback, but he's known to be the foundation for the Wolverines dynasty. He led the Wolverines to be a top 15 team then he was a key piece for the Wolverines championship runs. His stats weren't top tier but he was utilized as one of the best receiving backs in the nation. Ryan Brewer claims him as a swiss army knife for an offense.

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 284 Attempts, 945 Yards, 6 TDs & 53 Receptions, 821 Yards, 9 TDs

#24. (SS) Sylvester Stewart [6'3 214] [Clemson] [PROJECTED THIRD ROUND]

Recovered from a torn ACL to dominate in the ACC this season as a safety. He was able to pick off Kaplan twice despite losing to him 27-21 in the regular season. Overall, he would be a second round prospect if he weren't so injury prone. Due to him leaving the Clemson defense, they might fall out of the Top 25 rankings. He was a key piece in the secondary as well as the defensive captain for four seasons now. Rumors also surfaced that he has been hiding a foot injury for the last couple games. Just be weary when drafting Stewart.

#25. (TE) Youdlain Thibodeaux [6'3 232] [USC] [PROJECTED THIRD ROUND]

He was severely underutilized but he was a five star TE coming out of high school that committed to USC. Jackson Kegel didn't throw to him, although his speed and blocking ability stood out for the Trojans causing other receivers to get open. Many people compare him to a lighter and faster George Kittle. His hands are still in question due to him not getting the ball through the air. But he is probably the fastest Tight End in the class.

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 22 Receptions, 363 Yards, 1 TDs

#26. (DT) Trevon Harrison [6'2 293] [Alabama] [PROJECTED FOURTH ROUND]

Harrison was considered to be a first round DT until he was caught with 25 pounds of Marijuana in the trunk of his car and got suspended from Alabama football near the end of the season. You could say that him and Terrell Lawrence were the key pieces to the Alabama Defensive Line and missing both of them caused them to lose the two most important games of the season. They allowed him to participate in the NFL Combine.

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 1 FF, 4.5 Sacks, 17 TFLs, 63 Tackles

#27. (WR) Bo Layne [6'0 190] [Miami] [PROJECTED FOURTH ROUND]

After having an amazing Freshman season with Will Duff as his quarterback, he couldn't replicate another season similar to that freshman year. The new Miami Quarterback, Jack Ripley could not incorporate Layne into the new offense and it suffered Bo's draft stock and Miami's rankings. Bo Layne was simply at the wrong place at the wrong time with Miami. Bo Layne has been known to run past corners with ease, but Ripley wasn't able to launch it deep enough to complete passes.

#28. (QB) Dustin Hickman [6'6 247] [Georgia] [PROJECTED FOURTH ROUND]

Everyone thought of Dustin Hickman as Will Duff but for the SEC, around the same size, about the same arm strength, he was just less successful than Will Duff. After everyone seen how Will Duff turned out in the NFL, scouts rated him accordingly. Hickman says he has something to prove and will dominate the NFL someday. This comment seemingly lowered his draft stock and Georgia coach Menfree spoke out saying the NFL Scouts are "arrogant and can't take criticism"

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 3876 Yards, 35 TDs, 8 INTs & 176 Rushing, 2 TDs

#29. (ROLB) Isaac Waller [6'0 222] [LSU] [PROJECTED FIFTH ROUND]

Isaac Waller is one of the most undersized linebackers in the draft but he is a really good zone coverage linebacker. Coaches consider moving him to safety or cornerback. But it's pretty hard to deny how good he covers from sideline to sideline. Coaches don't think he is able to adjust to man to man coverage due to his lack of elite speed.

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 3 INTs, 1 FF, 2 Sacks, 11 TFLs, 56 Tackles

#30. (CB) Brandon Douglas [5'11 192] [Texas A&M] [PROJECTED FIFTH ROUND]

Brandon Douglas guided the Aggies to a pair of wins back to back and that's what he's been known for, sealing off primetime games against LSU and Tennessee. Douglas is the most clutch cornerback in the SEC, but outside of that what is he good for? He's also TAMU's star kick returner. In a game against Auburn, he returned two touchdowns in one quarter. He's a big time playmaker, but he does lack speed to be a solid man to man corner. He's known to be Zone Hawk though.

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 1 FF, 4 INTs, 8 TFLs, 61 Tackles

#31. (RE) Terrell Lawrence [6'5 307] [Alabama] [PROJECTED FIFTH ROUND]

You remember how I said Trevon Harrison got suspended for 25 pounds of marijuana? Well, Terrell Lawrence got put in Jail for holding someone at gunpoint FOR marijuana, now I don't get why he didn't just ask Harrison for some. But him being put in jail and bailed 6 months later definitely affects him. He was projected as a Top 5 pick until this situation happened. Lawrence has all the athleticism and skill to make the NFL, he just needs to keep his head in the right direction.

NOTABLE STATISTICS: 3 FFs, 11 Sacks, 17 TFLs, 88 Tackles **PREVIOUS SEASON**

#32. (WR) George Reynolds [5'10 203] [Florida State] [PROJECTED SIXTH ROUND]

The #1 Receiver for Kaplan, he looked amazing up until he faced off against Kimani White and the Notre Dame Fighting Irish. Reynolds got lit up catching a ball against White and he fractured his arm. Since then he wasn't able to play the same, dropping numerous passes but ultimately was able to create separation between most cornerbacks. With a little more unrusting and catching drills, he could be a steal.
