

Important Update: School Uniform Policy for the Upcoming Academic Year

Dear Boston Prep Students and Families,

I hope this message finds you well and enjoying your summer break. As we prepare for the upcoming academic year, we would like to inform you about an important update to our school uniform policy.

Boston Prep Mission Statement: Boston Prep Charter Public School prepares students to succeed in four-year colleges and embody, in thought and action, lifelong ethical growth.

Starting this fall, we are introducing some changes to our uniform requirements to ensure consistency, comfort, and a sense of unity among our students. Below are the key points of the updated policy:

1. Official Boston Prep Uniform Components:

Tops: Black Polo shirts (short/long sleeve)

Bottoms: Khaki pants, khaki skirts, khaki shorts

Shoes: Only Closed-toe shoes or sneakers (NO CROCS, SLIDES etc.)

2. Physical Education (PE) Uniform: (Permitted on Gym Days ONLY)

Bottoms: Boston Prep sweatpants only **Footwear:** Athletic shoes/sneakers

3. Purchasing Uniforms:

Uniforms can be purchased from our approved vendor Metro School Uniforms. (Link)

4. Dress Code Enforcement:

The updated uniform policy will be strictly enforced starting the first day of school on August 21, 2024.

Students not in compliance with the uniform policy will be provided with a loaner uniform in exchange for their cell phone device in collateral and parents will be notified.

We believe that a standardized uniform helps foster a focused learning environment and reduces distractions. We appreciate your support and cooperation in adhering to these guidelines.

Non- Negotiable Dress Code Policy (Important Changes)

Tops:

Any official **Boston Prep** top:

- Black Polo (short/long sleeve)
- Black Quarter Zip Sweatshirt
- Black Zip Up Fleece
- Crew Neck (new SY24)
- Maroon Cardigan
- Sport Jersey determined by coach

Students are **not permitted to wear hoodies** of any kind

Phoenix Hoodies
Team Hoodies
AP/Class Hoodies
No House Shirts

Bottoms:

Khaki Pants, Khaki Skirts, Khaki Shorts ONLY!

- Full length trouser
- Skirts/Shorts must be within an inch of the knee-length and waist height

Students are allowed to wear Boston Prep Branded sweatpants on PE days ONLY!



Shoes:

Any type of shoes are permissible except open toe shoes (for safety reasons). The following are NOT allowed:

Sandals
Slides/Crocs
Flip Flops
Slippers

Note: Any student out of Dress code will be asked to change upon entrance. Students are allowed to have access to two loaner uniforms throughout the school year. In order to be provided with a loaner uniform, cell phones are held in the Dean's office as collateral.

- If a student refuses to change into Dress Code, further disciplinary actions will be pursued.

Non-Negotiable Electronic Policy (Important Changes)

Boston Prep does not permit the use of personal electronic devices while on school grounds.

All personal electronics should be turned off and tucked away in student backpacks prior to entering the school campus.

If a student is found to be using any personal electronic device while on school grounds, they will be referred to the Dean's office and <u>must</u> turn in their device. The device will be stored away and returned to the student at the EOD. If this becomes a recurring event, the culture team will follow up with the student, family, and <u>WILL</u> result in disciplinary actions.

Non-Negotiable Lunch Policy


Free Lunch is provided daily to our students here at Boston Prep. Students are to report to the High School Cafeteria at their designated lunch time. Students are **NOT** permitted to leave the building during this time. This is considered a safety violation and further consequences will be implemented.

Parents / Guardians, and or relatives are not permitted to bring outside lunch to a student during the school day. If a student is bringing food from home, it should be with the student when they arrive on campus.

There is absolutely no food delivery services allowed!

The accountability **system** below ensures that the focus remains on maximizing learning. ALL infractions will be logged in DeansList

BEHAVIOR MATRIX:



Consequences Range from Detention - Out of School Suspension One Day or Greater

- Unauthorized leaving/entry of Class
- Tardiness to class (not seated by bell) Priority Issue
- Phone/Personal electronics (inhibits learning);
- Out of Uniform
- Off Task

Behaviors that warrant an automatic REFERRAL include but are not limited to:

Consequences Range from ICR, In School Suspension - Out of School Suspension Greater Than 3 days

- Vandalism / Destruction of Property / Arseny / False Fire Alarm
- Multiple students occupying bathroom stall (large stall)
- Refusal to leave school when Culture Team asks
- Sexual language (generalized)
- Harassment of students & staff (sexual / non-sexual legal criteria)
- Unprofessional / Aggressive language (Target / Generalized)
- Targeted Threats of violence to staff/students/community member
- Skipping class
 - (missed more than 10 minutes of class / Out of class without permission and pass) Priority Issue
- Possession of an unconventional item on school grounds
- Instigation of/during physical altercation (verbal, filming, directly ignoring staff direction)
- Horseplay in halls/class
- Class disruption (after management strategies and impacting whole class)

Consequences Range from Out of School Suspension 5 Days or Greater - Expulsion

- Possession/distribution/ Vaping/Use of Paraphernalia with a controlled substance
- Student arrives to school under the influence of a controlled substance (alcohol, maryjuana etc.)
- Weapon possession / look -a- like weapon -
- Assault on staff
- Committing / Attempting sexual assault
- Physical Altercation (Battery/Assault/Mutual),
- Bullying Confirmed / Act of (legal criteria met) with investigation completed by Deans
