Updated District Level Funding Calculations

2024 SFA - Methodology for districts, awaiting guidance for schools

District Funding Streams (each amount multiplied by pupil count)

Foundation (FF1): \$8,691.80

At-Risk, ELL, and Special Education: \$2,172.95 (each at 25% of FF1)

Cost of Living: \$1,999.11 (currently capped at 23% of FF1)

- Current phase-in: 18% (Governor's Revised January Budget Request)
 - District will receive 95.2% of New Formula Total Program Funding
 - Each line (FF1, At-Risk, Cost of Living, etc) will be scaled to align with phased-in Total Program Funding

Revenue: Embracing Uncertainty

2024 SFA - No current guidance around funding for schools

- In prior years, CDE published a calculation file for districts to calculate the risk-adjusted per-pupil funding for all charter schools established on or after July 1, 2004 (charter schools established prior to July 1, 2004 receive the district average per-pupil funding)
 - Calculation logic compared school FRL and ELL percentages to district average
 - Per-pupil funding increased (or decreased) according to ratio of school rate to district rate for each student group
- We do not know whether or how the state will advise districts to risk-adjust per-pupil funding at the school level for FY26
- We built out a possible risk-adjustment model by applying the state's district logic on the school level. It
 generates greater variability in per-pupil funding across schools, but these are estimates using uncertain
 (and generalized) assumptions and are subject to change

- FY26 Mill Levy estimated to increase by 2.25% from FY25
 - Largest increases in 2016 MLO funding streams
 - Many funding lines weighted for FRL and High Poverty (Direct Cert) student counts
 - School specific projections will be shared on March 10, 2025
- Capital Construction
 - Inconsistent funding growth since FY23
 - Schools in a district facility receive 50% of full allocation
- Programmatic Funding Allocations
 - ECE Classroom: \$160,110
 - Center Program: \$199,175
 - Additional para/mental health professional support for MI-Aut and AN-Sec centers
 - School specific projections will be shared on March 10, 2025



FY26 Administrative Fee and Reconciliation

Calculations based on most recently completed fiscal year (FY24)
Reconciliation is difference between amount charged in prior year and costs

- Below state mandated threshold of 5% of PPR
 - \$375.26 is 3.4% of FY24 district average per-pupil funding
- Overall increase from FY25 fee: \$21.91 (6.2%)

Projected FY26 \$

- Increase due to combination of increased costs and change in logic for Funded Pupil Count in FY24
 - Prior to FY24, we had CPP slots in our UPK. Some of those slots were preschoolers and they
 were included in our funded count
 - We don't charge fees for ECE students, but charter schools benefited from a larger denominator prior to FY24



FY26 Special Education Fee

Calculations based on most recently completed fiscal year (FY24) We do not calculate or collect a reconciliation for the Special Education Fee

- Overall increase from FY25** fee: \$188.27 (49.7%)
- ** FY25 fee was updated after budget development at most charter schools

- Increase due to combination of increased costs and change in logic for Funded Pupil Count in FY24
 - Substantial increases in funding for Dedicated Adult Support (1:1 Paras)
 - More precise district financial accounting alerted to lack of inclusion of central office support, operations, and compliance
 - Similar logic change in funded pupil count that impacts Administrative Fee
- *Potential for guidance around risk-adjustments for per-pupil funding to replace PSN Reserve Fee



Special Education Fee: Deeper Dive

Costs increased and funded pupil count logic changed

- Net special education expenses increased from \$34M in FY23 to \$48M in FY24
 - Part of this increase is attributable to the second year of working in a new financial system that allows for more detailed cost reporting and alignment with costs in 17XX (Special Education) programs
 - Dedicated Adult Support (1:1 Paraprofessional) expenses increased from \$21.7M in FY23 to \$28.7M in FY24 due to significant increase in student support across district managed and charter schools
 - The average salary/benefit cost for a 1:1 Para in FY24 was \$39,164
 - Each 1:1 Para position, in a district managed or a charter school, represents a \$0.46 per-pupil increase in the Special Education Fee



Use Fees: Facilities, Shared Campus, Shuttle

Sharing the cost of specific district services by the impacted schools Per-pupil amount is paid by membership count

- Facility Fee
 - Increases in maintenance expenses and insurance, rate of increase slightly outpacing increase in per-pupil funding
- Facility Fee 847.78 \$ 1.000.13 \$ 1.042.86 \$ 1.178.46 % of avg per-pupil 10.15% 10.68% 10.49% funding in fee year
