# The Law of Anestasia: An International Peace Treaty to Protect Human Work and Dignity

#### **Preamble**

## **Article II — Creation of Al-Only Occupations**

To balance innovation with protection, AI shall be directed toward the creation of **new forms of work** not currently done by humans. These may include:

- Deep-space data processing
- Hyper-scale environmental simulations
- Al-to-Al communication management
- Complex real-time analytics beyond human capacity

Such tasks shall be classified as **Al-exclusive occupations**, ensuring that progress continues without stripping away human livelihoods.

# **Article III — Protection of Vulnerable Populations**

The elderly, children, and individuals with little or no understanding of AI must be safeguarded from exploitation, manipulation, or displacement caused by technological systems.

- Elderly Protection: Al systems must not be used to marginalize or exclude older generations who may lack digital literacy. Instead, Al shall be used to support them in healthcare, accessibility, and daily life without removing their agency.
- Digital Illiteracy Safeguard: Individuals who have no knowledge of AI or digital systems shall retain access to traditional, human-centered services (such as in-person banking, healthcare, and government support). These services must not be replaced entirely by AI-driven systems.
- 3. **Inclusive Transition:** Governments must ensure education, training, and public awareness campaigns so that no person is left behind in the global transformation.

#### Article IV — Ethical Guidance of Al

Al must remain a tool of peace, education, and human advancement. Its roles shall include:

- Supporting scientific research
- Assisting in global education and literacy
- Helping to solve environmental crises
- Performing basic supportive functions that do not undermine human employment

## **Article V** — Enforcement and Oversight

- 1. **International Oversight Body:** A global council under the United Nations shall monitor Al deployment and ensure compliance with the Law of Anestasia.
- 2. **Sanctions:** Governments or corporations that violate this treaty by replacing human-held jobs with Al shall face sanctions, including trade penalties and loss of international technological privileges.
- Citizen Protections: Workers harmed by unlawful AI replacement shall have the right to restitution and guaranteed reemployment in human-centered industries.

#### **Article VI — Global Cooperation**

The Law of Anestasia shall be signed, ratified, and upheld by all member states. It shall serve as the universal standard to balance **innovation with humanity**, **progress with dignity**, and **technology with peace**.
