






#### My child feels safe in school




#### My child makes good progress




#### My child is well looked after




# My child is well taught




#### My child receives appropriate homework




#### The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved




# The school deals effectively with bullying




# The school is well led and managed




# I receive valuable information about my child's progress




# <sup>8</sup>The school responds to concerns I have
