-The vampyres in Twilight are virtually indestructible. The only way to kill a vampyre is to dismember the body of the vampyre and then burn them. If you just try to burn them they will remain unaffected, and if you just dismember their bodies they are able to be put back together.

-Vampyre society is overlooked by a monarch type figure, vampyres are hidden from human society but still can interact and coexist without the humans knowledge of them existing , vampire royalty own human servants that later may be converted into a vampire, Vampires are never born only converted

### *The Chronicles of Vladmir Tod By Z Brewer*

Book series, (First book - last book) August 13, 2007 - February 9, 2010, American pop culture, Young adult - action, Early teens (more masculine feel), Protagonist

- Pale skin, dark hair, \* “glyph” tattoo, \*fangs
- Telepathy, mind control, vampiric strength, super speed, levitation
- \*glyph tattoos are the mark of each vampire, they are unique to each vampire and can be used as a way to protect people. A glyph tattoo is usually given by the vampyres creator but in some cases different vampyres will give them their mark. When a glyph is burned into an object or place it protects or locks it Ex. when a vampire “burns” (by drawing your glyph in blood it burns into the surface of the

object) their glyph into an object owned by someone they love that individual is now protected by the vampire that placed the symbol there, \*Elysia is the name of vampire society, \*When vampires are hungry their fangs extend instead of always being the same size, \*The Pravus, \*Drudges, the effect a vampire's bite has on a human all depends on their intent. I.e. if a vampire bites a human with the intent of making them into a drudge they will become just that, When Vlad touches a glyph his eyes flash a purple color.

- Vampires can die by a stake to the heart, sun (not very severe in some cases and can be prevented by sunblock), garlic allergy, vampires can die from losing blood, or other things that would kill a human but not natural death, \*The “Lucis”, natural life is not explicitly mentioned but we can infer it’s most likely at least a couple of millenia seeing as how we are told there is a character that isn’t close to death in the slightest is around 1000 years old.

- \*Elysia is how other vampires live in society. It’s not a place, but the feeling of being around other vampires, the tattoo on the inside of your left wrist that displays your glyph marking is what alerts other vampires of their “vampireness” so to speak., The person that converts you into a vampire is considered your parent, \*The Pravus is a legend in which a vampire is born a vampire instead of being turned into one, they are told to be invincible and prophesied to rule over vampire society and enslave the human race. \*drudges are human “slaves” that vampires keep. A drudge is acquired by biting a human and making them do your bidding. Vampires are hidden from human society but are able to blend in and coexist with them

### *My Babysitters a Vampire (Bruce McDonald)*

Movie then TV show, 2010(movie) TV show (2011-2012), Canadian movie and TV show moved to Disney Channel, horror comedy, targeted towards preteen, Erica, Sarah, and Rory are main characters. Jesse and other whitechapel vampires are seen as villains until season two, other species list: werewolves, zombies, witches, sirens, demonic possession (cars, children, trees, reanimated animals, cameras, mirrors), goddesses, ghosts, mummies, demonic mist, franken monsters, seers, native cultural appropriation.

- Physical features/appearance: normal human appearances, retractable fangs, eyes change color to yellow on command or when a vampire is going to eat, sharp teeth on the seconds” (incisors)

- Powers: can heal themselves/regenerate (Rory no longer had asthma or needed glasses), flight, super speed, super strength, mind control, super smell, super hearing, super vision, exert venom\*

- Lore/How vampyre society works (i.e. monarchy, are they known about by humans, do they have an essential part in society, can humans be “converted”, etc.): Vampires are fledglings when they are bitten\* Because of the venom in their bodies, they then have two weeks to drink human blood and transform into a full vampire or they will die. Sarah drank a blood substitute made by Bennys grandma and is fine in the end. All vampires are ruled by the vampire council, the rules of the vampire council that we hear in the movie and show are against grave robbing and stealing food from other vampires. Other than that, the vampire council isn’t really talked about otherwise. In the movie we learn there was a mass genocide against vampires that Jesse (main movie villain) was alive for. The lucifractor was used to kill all vampires except the ones that were able to survive.
