A grave sin is when someone disobeys a divine law in a grievous matter with full knowledge and consent. The matter may be serious either in itself, for example blasphemy, or because of the circumstances, such as striking one's father or mother, or due to its purpose like telling a lie in order to destroy a person's character. This will usually involve a few prayers, or even an act of volunteering.
