	<p>2nd parcel tax around the corner. Our board will initiate the process in preparation of the transition. Therefore, Stewart has nominated Hal Gin to be chair to the nomination committee. Elaine Peng, Michael Moon, Mike Lok, Esther Hsu, and Suzie Lee will be part of the nomination committee. In instances where there is a tied vote, Stewart will become the tiebreaker.</p> <p>Hal Gin shared remarks of the committee commitment. He will initiate the process for each of the committee board member to meet.</p> <p>The nomination committee will be supported by Marco Li Mandri , Jennifer Li, and Chris Cameron (lawyer)</p> <p>Stewart also nominated Kenneth Tang and Tony Trinh as the evaluation committee to create a metric to conduct evaluation of our new executive director.</p>	
<p><b>Committee Reports</b></p>	<p>(Executive Committee)</p> <p>Suzie Lee, the Treasurer, reported that we have secured the office space. There will be some expected expense to furnish the OCIC office. 	<p>(District Identity and Placemaking) Hal shared a community festival on Saturday June 11th 10-5pm, 4 square blocks of Chinatown with the goal of support local merchant while celebrating the cultural aspect. 10,000 will be put. The event is expected to generate income to cover our cost. Council President Bas has agreed covered the cost of street cleaning. Other public officials have also expressed their support for the event. 14 of District Identity committee members agree and bring this recommendation to the full board.</p> <p>Chiaki offered to volunteer for music as entertainment</p> <p>Elaine and Ener responded Wladimir Wlassowsky from the public question regarding the budget.</p> <p>(Civil Sidewalks) Ener shared two additional co-chairs ( Esther Hsu and Elaine Peng) and secretary ( Sky Liang) to the civil sidewalks committee. A committee meeting was held on March 15th. Next committee meeting will be on April 12th. Ener shared wanting to focus ambassador program, security guards, and volunteer groups. 2 Questions were raised from our last meeting and hoping it can be addressed at the upcoming committee meeting. First question, request of new staffing for OCIC, committee member wanting OCIC to hire an operation manager . Second question is the general direction of the ambassador program, is it a relationship building program, safety responsibilities oriented or maintenance focused. The civil sidewalk will also be bringing a recommendation to our next board meeting mainly for allocate funds for volunteers group to use on food.</p>	<p><b><i>Sky Liang moved, and Chiaki Ueyama seconded approval committing \$10,000 to host dragonboat festival. The motion was approved unanimously</i></b></p>
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	<p>(Land Use) Rick shared Landuse committee met with downtown CBD staff. Downtown CBD is requesting us to present what type of services OCIC will produce for their merchants.</p> <p>Sky asked can we clarify which properties is under our OCIC jurisdiction? Rick responded there is map that indicate which area overlap between OCIC and downtown CBD. Stewart appointed Jennifer to look into the map and consult Marco.</p> <p>Tony shared potential topics (flex street and howard terminal stadium) for next month landuse committee.</p>	
<b>Other</b>	<p>Stewart readdressed the nomination committee that was raised earlier and received confirmation from Hal Gin, Suzie, Elaine, Michael Moon, Mike Lok, and Esther will be seating in the committee.</p> <p>Linda Liu made a comment regarding hardship for disabilities to pay into increased property taxes. Suzie responded there are businesses who are exempted from paying taxes, potentially suggestion is to research to look into what are the qualification for exemption .</p>
