

One University, One Student IT Ecosystem

The Student Information System (SIS) Project will create a modular, scalable, secure, integrated set of tools that help the university meet evolving student needs and institutional priorities and contribute to improvements in the overall student, faculty and staff experience.

Contrary to its name, the SIS Project is not just one project, but a portfolio of projects and supporting work being undertaken in service of modernizing our student information systems.

PRIMARY PROJECTS

- Replacing ISIS with the **Triton Student System (TSS)**
- **Continuity Planning** to ensure uninterrupted functionality of SIS data dependent reports, processes, and systems after the transition
- Replacing the current graduate funding tool with a new **Financial Support Payments Tool (FSPT): Stipends Module** **COMPLETE ✓**
- Implementing a curriculum management system, **CourseLeaf**, to replace eCourse
- Adding **transfer articulation** capabilities to the uAchieve system
- Implementing a new student billing and payments system, **Transact**, for both general campus and Extended Studies **COMPLETE ✓**

SUPPORTING WORK

- Mapping, analyzing, and improving our business processes
- Bringing the Division of Extended Studies (DES) on to existing general campus systems, such as Slate, 25Live, and uAchieve **COMPLETE ✓**
- Updating existing systems that will be maintained post SIS Project, including the Virtual Advising Center (VAC)

As a people leader, what is my role in this change?

The most important actions you, as a people leader, can take at this time are 1) to stay informed about the project and 2) to begin having conversations **now** with your staff about the changes that may occur because of the project. Listening to your staff's hopes and fears about changes and sharing those with us will both help your staff navigate the upcoming changes and help us as we continue with planning and execution of the project.
