- 1. Notice
- 2. Design the opportunity
- 3. Training and set boundaries
- 4. Give the child space to practice

Message adult hopes to send -

- 1. I believe in your ability to figure this out
- 2. You are capable
- 3. You can do things that feel uncomfortable

Mindset we hope the child will develop -

- 1. I am capable
- 2. I can handle new and unexpected experiences
- 3. I can do hard things

What would you like to do about that? An empowering response to a child who feels wronged
