System of Arrangement:

This collection is divided into three series, which are further divided into subseries. The first series deals with the research notes Diana Helmer created throughout the time she was researching for the book *Belles of the Ballpark*. Within this series, two subseries exist including (a) Research Notes and (b) Thought Collection. Subseries b deals with chapter outlines, often annotated and also includes contents of envelopes that seemed to be used to collect thoughts on certain topics, utilizing the way these envelopes were labeled for folder names. The second series regards the sources she used in this research. It is further broken into the subseries (a) Books; (b) Primary Sources; (c) Secondary Sources; and (d) Players' Association Newsletters. The final series revolves around other works Helmer produced in regards to women's baseball, along with publishing materials from the *Belles of the Ballpark* book.

### Scope Note:

This collection revolves around research largely done in the late 1980s and early 1990s, at the beginning of the popularity of the All American Girls Professional Baseball League, which gained popularity with the development of the 1992 blockbuster, *A League of Their Own*. Diana Helmer's work largely focused on the Racine Belles, a team in the All American Girls Professional Baseball League, and was furthered by her close relationship with Anna May Hutchinson and Irene Hickson, players from the league. While there is correspondence with other players and fans of the game, the relationship between these women is central and capable of being seen throughout all aspects of the research.

#### *Players' Association Newsletters*

Series II, subseries d contains newsletters from the All American Girls Professional Baseball League Players' Association, a group that was created in the 1980s to reconnect many of the players from the league's years. In 1981, to foster connection between reunions and in-person meetings, a newsletter was begun that would develop into Touching Bases in later years. While this collection of newsletters was in possession of Diana Helmer and many of them were addressed to her, a large portion of these newsletters came from Irene Hickson to assist Helmer in her research, especially as she researched the current lives of the players. It is likely that the collection here is not exhaustive of the newsletters that were published in the years contained here.

#### *Anna May Hutchinson*

Anna May (or Mae) "Hutch" Hutchinson (1925-1998) was a pitcher and catcher in the All American Girls Professional Baseball League from 1944 to 1948. In her tenure, she played for both the Racine Belles (1944-1949) and the Muskegon Lassies (1949). The Louisville, Kentucky native was a prominent side arm pitcher in the League and threw a no-hitter, led her team to a championship, and made two all star teams in her career. Injuries to her arm cut her career short, though. Following her baseball career, Hutchinson resided in Kenosha, Wisconsin and became a respected golfer, bowler, and teacher. Following her retirement in 1987, she moved to Racine, Wisconsin. She was inducted with the rest of the League to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1988. Due to the advocacy of then-IWBC Director Ryan Woodward, "Hutch" was part of the Class of 2020 Kentucky Sports Hall of Fame.

### *Irene Hickson*

Irene Hickson (1915-1995) was a catcher in the All American Girls Professional Baseball League from 1943 to 1951. She played for both the Racine Belles (1943-1950) and the Kenosha Comets (1951). Prior to playing for the League, Hickson was a semi-professional softball player, a track and field champion, and a boxer. She would also play for a men's minor league baseball team for a time after her professional women's career. Following her sports career, she opened a restaurant called *Home Plate* and worked for Zayre. She was inducted with the rest of the League to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1988.

### *All American Girls Professional Baseball League*

The All American Girls Professional Baseball League was an all-women's professional baseball league that functioned during the war years, when men's baseball had declined due to drafting of service members. Founded by Philip K. Wrigley in 1943, it passed ownership twice in its tenure (to Arthur Meyerhoff in 1944 and to a decentralized team owner structure in 1950). At its height, the League played in 14 cities and drew one million fans. As men returned to the baseball diamond and the rise of televised games increased, it became more difficult to maintain the women's league. The League folded in 1954 and the popularity of the League was revitalized with *A League of Their Own* in 1992. The League was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1988, where it is part of the permanent Women in Baseball exhibit there.

### *Racine Belles*

The Racine Belles was one of the inaugural teams of the All American Girls Professional Baseball League and disbanded after the 1950 season. Located in Racine, Wisconsin, the team played at Horlick Field. The team touted a powerhouse team through several seasons, and won the League Championship in 1943 and 1946.

### *Bells of the Ballpark*

Published in 1993 by Diana Star Helmer, this illustrated book attempts to tell the history of the League with a focus on the Racine Belles. While the research started in the late-1980s as the League became more known to people, it was published a year after the blockbuster hit, and people felt it was a good depiction of the "real" story that the movie left out.

### *Publishing Materials*

Series III, folder 5 contains publishing materials surrounding the book *Belles of the Ballpark*. Contained within this folder are items regarding marketing, outlines, and publisher correspondence.

**Biographical Note:**

Diana Star Helmer (1962- ) is an American writer most known in the women's baseball world for her 1993 book *Belles of the Ballpark* which followed the Racine Belles of the All American Girls Professional Baseball League following the release of the 1992 movie, *A League of Their Own*. Helmer's career as a writer has included work in children's genres, screen and playwriting, and sports and fitness, with her later career focusing on children's materials. Beyond her Belles work, Helmer wrote on women's baseball leading up to the launch of the 1992 film and wrote more general about *Baseball* (1999) in her Game Plan Series. She has also more generally written about women's sports and women's history, including her Teamwork in Action Series, where she addressed specific Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) teams.
