About The Bills

Background: Millions of tons of toxic coal ash - a forever pollutant - are sitting in unlined waste pits in the floodplains of our major rivers and Lake Michigan, contaminating groundwater and threatening the waterways. Indiana is currently allowing coal ash disposal in the floodplain and disposal that contaminates groundwater. These are not the permanent, stable disposal solutions that coal ash needs.

By contrast, many other states are removing coal ash from leaking disposal sites in the floodplain and recycling the ash or taking it to properly lined landfills on high ground. This safe disposal is happening in North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, Florida, Tennessee, and Georgia. In fact, this process has already been completed for millions of tons of coal ash in these other states.

Solution: SB 367 and HB 1469 will:

- Protect Indiana's rivers and drinking water resources from coal ash
- Increase safe recycling of coal ash through reuse in concrete, bricks, and roofing material
- Create jobs in coal ash cleanup and recycling
- Improve safety during coal ash cleanup for workers and the community
- Require the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission to review of the ratepayer impacts from utilities' coal ash cleanup and ways to reduce that impact

<u>Economic-Focused Sample Email Structure (NOTE: everything in italics should be personalized)</u>:

Dear (State Senator or Representative) (Last Name):

I am writing to urge you to (support/co-sponsor/give a hearing to) (Senate Bill 367/House Bill 1469) which would allow for Clean Closure excavation of coal ash impoundments in Indiana, which is economically advantageous and better for our health, communities, workers and the environment.

(Briefly state why you support the proposed legislation, using personal experience is vital. In this instance, we are focusing on ECONOMIC IMPACT so in addition, feel free to draw on the below bullet points.)

I am asking you to support this legislation due to the following economic advantages:

- Clean Closure is superior to the Cap-in-Place alternative. Cap in Place will only allow groundwater contamination to continue and prove costly in the long run.
- By utilizing Clean Closure, more than 24 job categories could be created. These jobs will pay in the range of approximately \$30-40 per hour.
- Clean Closure provides more than double the amount of jobs than Cap in Place, i.e. Clean Closure = 218 jobs vs. Cap in Place = 92 jobs.
- Other states have successfully excavated their coal ash pits with rate increases to the consumer at less than .50 cents per month.
- Property values around sites using Clean Closure rose from 11.5%-15%.
