<u>Disaster Unemployment Assistance</u>

Residents whose take-home pay was impacted by the February winter storm can now apply for Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA) through the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC).

Workers who lost their jobs and self-employed individuals who have been unable to work due to damage sustained from the winter storm may be eligible for DUA benefits.

DUA is an unemployment insurance benefit made available especially for victims of disaster and is available to individuals who:

- Have applied for and used all regular unemployment benefits, including Pandemic Emergency
 Unemployment Compensation (PEUC) and Extended Benefits (EB), from any state, or do not qualify
 for unemployment benefits
- Worked or were self-employed or were scheduled to begin work or self-employment in the disaster area
- Can no longer work or perform services because of physical damage or destruction to the place of employment as a direct result of the disaster
- Establish that the work or self-employment they can no longer perform was their primary source of income
- Cannot perform work or self-employment because of an injury as a direct result of the disaster
- Became the breadwinner or major support of a household because of the death of the head of household, or
- Were unable to reach their job or self-employment location because they must travel through the affected area and are prevented from doing so by the disaster.

Applications must be submitted by **March 26, 2021**. When applying, specify that the application is related to the damage caused by severe storms.

Donations of Water, Food, and Additional Supplies:

Numerous community organizations are calling for donations of water, food, and other supplies across Austin. Please consider contributing if you have the means to do so:

- <u>ATX Free Fridge</u>: The <u>community fridge program</u> with <u>three locations</u> is <u>still accepting food</u> donations as well as other cold-weather supplies.
- <u>Casa Marianella</u>: The nonprofit is <u>collecting</u> food donations (rice, eggs, milk, fruit, meat, bread, etc.) and bottled drinking water at its shelter on 821 Gunter Street.
- Austin Pets Alive is collecting <u>drinkable water</u> for people and pets, in addition to <u>monetary</u> donations.

Monetary Donations

Numerous organizations across Austin are calling for monetary donations to support our neighbors during this critical time of need. If you have the means, you can make financial contributions to the following organizations:

- <u>Austin Area Urban League</u> The local affiliate of the civil rights organization is accepting monetary donations to help provide emergency shelter, food, clothing, and other supplies for the unhoused population.
- <u>Austin Disaster Relief Network</u> The nonprofit is accepting monetary donations to help buy gift cards, pay for emergency housing and transportation, and supplies for people impacted by weather-related incidents.
- <u>The Austin EMS Relief Fund</u> The Austin EMS Association is collecting monetary donations for its fund to help feed first responder/medics during the storm.
- <u>Good Work Austin's Community Kitchen</u> The small business advocacy group including several restaurants such as LOca d'Oro, Reunion 19, Salt & Time, and Baby Greens, among others is accepting monetary donations for its meal program feeding those in need.
- <u>Austin Mutual Aid</u> The mutual aid group is collecting monetary donations to help book hotel rooms for the city's unhoused population through GoFundMe and Venmo (both @austinmutualaidhotels and @austinmutualaid)

Repair Resources and Assistance

The City of Austin has launched a new <u>website</u> to support local residents and business owners whose properties were damaged in the recent winter storm. Visitors to <u>austintexas.gov/atxrepairs</u> will find information about plumbers, electricians, and other contractors; code compliance and service requests; the City's emergency permitting process; homeowner's funding assistance; and federal and local assistance programs. Home Repair Assistance for Eligible Homeowners

The City of Austin is increasing its home repair program funding by \$1 million to assist Austinites impacted by the recent storm, made possible through a transfer from Austin Water. The Housing and Planning Department's home repair program can assist eligible homeowners who need repairs following the February cold weather event, also known as Winter Storm Uri.

Information related to home repairs for eligible homeowners will be posted and updated on this website the week of February 22. To learn more about the City's home repair programs and assistance to qualifying households, visit the home repair program webpage.

FEMA Individual Assistance

Households in <u>Travis county are eligible to apply for disaster assistance through FEMA</u>.

- Uninsured: Apply online at http://DisasterAssistance.gov or call 1-800-621-3362 or 1-800-462-7585 TTY.
- Insured: File a claim with their insurance company and then apply to FEMA. FEMA cannot duplicate benefits if you received insurance from your provider first.

Assistance can include grants for temporary housing and home repairs, low-cost loans to cover uninsured property losses and other programs to help individuals and business owners recover from the effects of the disaster.

Households need to do the following:

- Take pictures and/or videos
- Make a list of damaged or lost items
- Contact your insurance company immediately and file a claim with them first
- Hang on to any receipts that you may have
- Do not enter the home if it is unsafe

Permitting and Emergency Repairs

Residents can begin work repairing homes as soon as they are able, and should contact the Development Services Department within one business day to acquire a permit if needed.

Rumor Control and Scams

FEMA:

- FEMA announced that there is a false phone number being shared with a message about FEMa paying for hotels. This is a scam
- FEMA is not supporting individual households with generators. These generators are for critical infrastructures such as hospitals and water facilities.
- FEMA is not providing \$800 in food vouchers
- FEMA does not pay for insurance deductibles or duplicate benefits
- FEMA disaster assistance does not cover for high electric bills

Scams:

- Do not trust anyone who offers financial help and then asks for money or person information
 - o FEMA and HHSC never charge for disaster assistance
 - o Federal and local disaster workers do not solicit or accept money
 - Beware of visits, calls or email from people claiming to be from FEMA asking for your social security number, bank account, or other sensitive information. Giving out this type of information can lead to identity theft.

Trash, Recycling, and Compost

All curbside services will resume on Monday, February 22. Please set out carts, bulk and large brush by 6:30 a.m. on your scheduled collection day. Collections may take longer than usual, due to road conditions

and excess material to be collected. Leave any uncollected carts, and other material at the curb to allow our crews to catch up over the week and into next weekend.

Scheduled large brush and bulk item collections that were missed due to the severe weather will begin on Monday and continue throughout the week until crews catch up. Additionally, Austin Resource Recovery will be working with Austin Energy to collect any brush leftover from electrical repairs.

Extra composting and recycling is always collected at no charge. Any bagged household trash that was missed in the last collection will be collected at no additional charge.

Service delays have probably left you with extra material to be collected. Here are some tips to set out extra material:

- Recycling: once your blue cart is full, place additional recyclables in a cardboard box or other reusable container next to your cart.
- Composting: once your green cart is full, use lawn and leaf bags or a reusable container that is no larger than 34-gallons and no heavier than 50 pounds for any excess material, and place them beside the cart.
- Trash: once your brown cart is full, place any extra bagged household trash from your missed collection beside your cart.

Austin Public Health COVID-19 Testing and Vaccinations

Austin Public Health (APH) <u>resumed COVID-19 operations today</u>, <u>Feb. 21.</u>, following more than a week of severe winter weather that resulted in suspended operations at testing and vaccination sites.

Rescheduling for vaccine appointments is underway for the estimated 3,300 patients who had appointments canceled starting on Feb. 13. If you had an appointment, please check your phone and email frequently for updates. Phone banks were also affected by power outages and will be back online to call those without internet access. There are plans for a queuing system, but at the moment to address the backlog, staff will manually schedule each person and provide them with a time, date and location.

Operations safely resumed on Sunday, Feb. 21, and will expand back to additional sites throughout the week. APH will also extend hours to serve as many people as possible with the vaccine APH has been allocated.

Austin Energy Updates

Electric bills concerns: Austin Energy sent out a <u>press release</u> earlier today (2/20) assuring customers that they should NOT expect to see massive electric bills as a result of the winter storm. Austin Energy's base rates are fixed, and any changes must be authorized by Austin City Council after the rate review process. Customers will only be charged for the power consumed and will be charged at existing rates as approved in the November 2020 rate tariff. Read the <u>press release</u> for further information.
