Digital Literacy and Citizenship Curriculum Mapping

Grades K through 12

In light of recent incidents and activities involving technology and social media, throughout Long Island and New York State, it is important to re-evaluate and identify areas in which we as a district help to mold and guide student knowledge as it relates to digital citizenship. Given the ease of access, and the potential dangers of social media and the internet, it is important that we provide the necessary skills for students and parents to navigate the complexities and dangers of these programs. Below, we have provided a curriculum mapping guide that outlines the expectations of what is being addressed and taught at every grade level. Please review these guides with your teachers to ensure that all are working towards this common goal.

Primary Level:

Middle Level

Grade 6

- Wheel teachers use the digital citizenship program EverFI with all students- Done through 1st wheel rotation. All students complete within the 1st quarter.
- October is when the Tech Coach begins to start pushing in with classes to promote digital citizenship. (The Library Media Specialist should be the main provider of this type of instruction)
 - Library Media Specialists will be taking this task over for 22-23 school year.
- SCPD PCT Officers (Officer Levy) complete classroom visits discussing internet safety and digital citizenship. (4x a year/ one of the dates focusing on Digital citizenship)

Grade 7

- October is when Tech Coach begins to start pushing in with classes to promote digital citizenship. (The Library Media Specialist should be the main provider of this type of instruction)
- PTA “Don’t Press Send” and/or SCPD 2nd PCT Officer (Levy) holds an assembly on internet safety and digital citizenship. (upcoming/potential)
- Extended homeroom activities once every quarter on internet safety and digital citizenship, starting November. (lessons given by Tech Mentor)

Grade 8

- October is when Tech Coach begins to start pushing in with classes to promote digital citizenship. (The Library Media Specialist should be the main provider of this type of instruction)
- SCPD 2nd PCT Officer (Levy) holds an assembly on internet safety and digital citizenship.
- Extended homeroom activities once every quarter on internet safety and digital citizenship, starting November. (lessons given by Tech Mentor)

High School Level

At the high school level, greater emphasis and focus is placed on teenagers' activity on social media platforms such as Instagram and Snapchat, through a series of grade assemblies and small-group learning circles. This is accomplished at all grade levels during their High School career. In addition to this, multiple courses at the high school focus on providing skill sets as it relates to digital literacy and citizenship within the prescribed curriculum. The emphasis of digital footprint, and how that can affect a student's later career and future, is discussed within these elective courses.
