Paying for Dual-Credit Courses – Trigg County High School – 2024-2025

Each student is responsible for paying for dual-credit courses. For 2024-2025, the cost of dual-credit courses rate is \$93 per credit hour, as of right now. That could change before school starts. Most courses are 3 credit hours, but science courses are often 4 credit hours.

This cost of dual credit courses is substantially lower than the cost for students when they actually attend college. Some assistance is available to pay for courses; however, students are responsible for securing that assistance or paying for the course(s).

Kentucky Dual-Credit Scholarship (KHEAA – Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority)

- Students are eligible to receive a Dual-Credit Scholarship for up to two successfully completed courses per year for their junior and senior year.
- Students must apply for the scholarship through KHEAA at www.kheaa.com. Funds are limited, so students should apply for the scholarship as soon as it becomes available and no later than **Oct. 1** for the fall and **March 1** for the spring.
- Students are required to complete a college success counseling session, which can be found on the Dual Credit Website (see the link in any email from Ms Young or Mrs. Shelton).
- Students who receive a dual-credit scholarship and go on to fail or withdraw from the course are required to pay TCHS for the cost of the course.

Work Ready Dual-Credit Scholarship (KHEAA – Kentucky Higher Education Assist. Authority)

- Students are eligible to receive a Work Ready Dual-Credit Scholarship for up to two approved Career & Technical Education (CTE) dual-credit courses per year (9th – 12th).
- Students must apply for the scholarship through KHEAA at www.kheaa.com. Funds are limited, so students should apply for the scholarship as soon as it becomes available and no later than **Oct. 1** for fall and **March 1** for spring.
- Funds are awarded on a first-come, first-served order based on the date students submit their scholarship preferences.
- Approved dual credit courses are limited to Career and Technical Education (CTE) coursework that is in a career pathway approved by the Kentucky Department of Education as leading to an industry-recognized credential. TCHS approved courses can be found on the Dual Credit Website (see the link in any email from Ms Young or Mrs. Shelton).
- Students who receive a Work Ready Dual-Credit Scholarship and go on to fail or withdraw from the course are required to pay TCHS for the cost of the course.

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Rotary Reimbursement per Year

- Rotary will reimburse eligible students up to \$279 for the cost of dual-credit classes and materials (books, etc.) each year.
 - Juniors and Seniors: If you meet 2 of the 3 ACT/KYOTE benchmarks, you may receive up to \$279 reimbursements.
 - Seniors Only: If you meet all 3 ACT/KYOTE benchmarks, you may receive up to \$558 reimbursements.
- To receive reimbursement, students must first pay for the class/book, etc. Students should then turn in a copy of the itemized statement and receipt to Ms. Young or Mrs. Shelton at the high school. Receipts may also be emailed to denise.young@trigg.kyschools.us or laura.shelton@trigg.kyschools.us. Be sure the student's name is included in the email or on the receipt. They will process so that students can get reimbursed. (Students can be reimbursed as needed. In other words, if a student pays for a book in the fall semester that costs \$54, after receiving the reimbursement the student would have \$225 remaining to use in the spring.) **All requests for Rotary reimbursement must be received by May 1.**

NOTE: Students may still have to pay for instructional materials, textbooks or online instructional codes that would not be covered by the KHEAA scholarships.
