

## Physical Education Philosophy

As obesity rates are on the rise, it is extremely important to realize that going to Physical Education class twice a week for 40 minutes is not enough. Thus I believe it will be my duty as a physical educator to show students' ways in which they can get their 60 minutes of physical activity in each day. I want to show my students that exercising doesn't need to be a tedious and boring thing, but rather make them more enthusiastic about moving. I believe that physical education is not "recess" time or a time for students to run around and burn off all their energy, but rather is a time for learning to take place.

Physical education class is not only a place where psychomotor learning takes place. Physical education teachers should strive to make exercise and movement enjoyable and this is done by creating a positive learning environment. When students learn in an environment that is welcoming, research has been shown that physical activity increases self esteem and also works on social skills. Thus the benefits of physical education class go way beyond the physical benefits for the body but also reach out to create positive mental and social attitudes.

As a physical educator, it will be my job to instill a passion for physical activity in the minds of my students. I will help my students discover who they are as individuals and will help them find success in becoming active and fit individuals.
