Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Woodside Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was not identified for improvement and has not been given one of these labels.

Woodside Elementary is a K-5 building focused on learning for all. The key challenges we face are nearly 80% of our students are receiving free and reduced lunch and approximately 30% of our students are identified as English Learners (EL).

Key initiatives in place to raise achievement for all are targeted Tier 2 and Tier 3 interventions in literacy and math for students not at grade level on interim and formative assessments. In reading we are working on improving Tier 1 instruction through increased fidelity, implementing instructional routines for the delivery of phonics and phonemic awareness instruction, and using data to inform classroom instruction. For math, we have implemented support through the online program, *iREADY!* We are committed to providing the best individualized instruction for all students while working to support the social emotional needs of all students.

Process for Assigning Students

Woodside Elementary School services approximately 452 young-kindergarten through 5th grade. Students are assigned to Woodside Elementary based on grade level and West Ottawa Public School's Elementary Attendance Boundaries. Students from within the district and outside the district may attend Woodside through Schools of Choice.

A Brief Description of Woodside Elementary School

Woodside Elementary services both a general education population of K-5 students and special education students through inclusion and a resource program. We annually serve approximately 452 students in our school. We fully implement a Multi Tier System of Supports to ensure high levels of learning for all students. We have an active parent/volunteer community, which provides Woodside Elementary an additional support and relationship to draw upon.
