Instructional Assistants and volunteers help teachers to run small project-based learning centers that truly engage our young learners. More funding is key to maintain our IAs in 2023 -2024. Can you make a contribution to our PTA? **We are only 15% away from our \$250,000 goal!** Thank you for your consideration.

We hope to bring a TK program to MES and need students to enroll before we can hire. Please save your child's spot by enrolling now. (Twenty-five (25) TK applications have been picked up but only four (4) have been returned. We need students before we can hire a TK teacher and set up the classroom.) We are now enrolling for next school year. Please contact Registrar Kim Rivetti in the office to begin. Enrollment is done online this year. This new paperless system not only saves parents and staff time, but improves data accuracy.

State Testing begins on Monday. The school is on quiet mode during these weeks. **3rd-5th students who arrive late to school on a testing day will wait in the office until 10:00 AM.** Opt out students will read or do computer work in Room 2 or the library. No phone calls will be made to testing classrooms from 8:30 AM – 10:00 AM on a testing day. Together through cooperation we can help our students better concentrate during their examinations.

Safety at Malibu Elementary / Reunification Plan

Important: At MES we have a plan to keep all students safe in case of all sorts of emergencies and natural disasters. Try not to panic! Don't immediately rush to school – take care of your home first! No child will be sent home in an emergency – children will be kept safe at school until they are signed out to a designated adult.

When you arrive at school, park away from the campus to keep the parking lot clear for emergency vehicles.

To have your child released to your care, go to the "Request Gate" near the play structure. The members of the Request Gate Team are responsible for greeting parents, guardians, or designees and providing them with tags or other identifications authorizing the holders to reunite with their students at the Reunion Gate. Once you have your tag, walk to the "Reunion Gate". The members of the Reunion Gate Team are responsible for sending a runner to bring your child to you. Your child will remain with his or her teacher, or with another staff member until you or a designated representative After 72 hours other civil authorities will arrives. provide additional care for unclaimed children and MES will likely become a disaster relief center. (Reunification Map) (On-site Assembly Map)

Note: Children will only be released to a person listed on the current Emergency Card. That person will have to show valid identification to the teacher, and sign a release form which our school will retain for recording purposes.

Thank you to the fifteen (15) families who were able to voluntarily donate to the 5th Grade Overnight Trip to Pali Camp for the 2023 - 2024 school year. We have already collected \$6440! We need \$6,847.50 by June 20 to keep our reservation. If we come up short, we will have to cancel and receive a portion of our deposit back.

We have secured our spot from October 18th-October 20th. Make your donation via the PTA website store in lieu of fundraising for now. This will help us to know which families are attending MES next year and which families are able to donate. The voluntary donation amount per student is \$460. This covers the bus to the camp, lodging, meals, instruction, and supervision personnel. You may make two installments of \$230 if that works better for your family. The first payment to the camp is due June 20. The last installment of \$6,847.50 will be due September 18. Therefore please make your donation by May and August. DreamBox - Family Dashboard

DreamBox is a signature program for MES. DreamBox is adaptive and builds conceptual understanding through games. Students are expected to minimally complete five (5) lessons a week. Dreambox is accessible through Clever on our school website: Link. DreamBox also provides data to teachers who can in turn customize assignments for students. Our Teacher Leadership Team and the SSC continue to prioritize DreamBox.

If you want your child to achieve more and faster, then set up your Family DashBoard! The **Family Insight Dashboard** (sometimes simply referred to as the Family Dashboard) allows parents and guardians to monitor their student's learning trends, gaps, and growth. It allows you to see at a glance if your student is mastering the concepts and making progress with DreamBox. Detailed activity and proficiency reports help you set learning goals and prepare conversations with your student and your student's teacher.

Do not help your child win the games because this tricks the computer into making the games much harder on the child way too fast.

Parent Input Form for Special Consideration during Classroom Placement Process

Sometimes parents and guardians want to give some input into which classroom their child is placed next year. Parental input is valued and considered, however parents and guardians must understand that our larger goal is to create classrooms that are balanced according to the criteria below. We cannot promise a specific teacher. We want to create the best overall learning situation for the most students possible.

If your child does have a distinctive situation or unusual learning need, then please let us know. The teachers and administration take pride in our balanced approach, but we also recognize special considerations. However, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to meet everyone's requests because of the many variables to balance.

When describing your child's unique educational needs, we ask that you try to avoid including teacher names or room numbers. This is because teacher assignments may change over the summer and even after the year begins. If you do include a teacher name, then we must remind you that we cannot promise you a specific teacher. Thank you for acknowledging our requests and for understanding our larger goal of creating balanced classes to meet the greatest needs. Here is the form link.

Private School Recommendation Letters

As a district we are respectfully declining to write letters of recommendation for students applying to private schools. We want to best use our limited time and resources for activities that impact all of our students in our schools. Writing letters takes us away from our work with our students.

If you are applying to a private school for your child, we will send a form letter to the school explaining our reasoning, and that the district's lack of recommendation letter in no way suggests a negative reflection of your children. <u>Teachers will not be completing recommendation letters nor will they be</u>

completing any checklists. We can provide report cards, and any information already in your child's file; however, teachers will not create any new information or provide anytype of recommendation for private schools.

We believe students who have attended MES are well positioned to be a positive addition to any school community— and we hope you will all continue to consider SMMUSD school options as wonderful learning environments for your children.
