PARENT CONTRACT

Parents of an athletic coop team member understand the commitment to a Team Unit that their child has chosen to accept. Along with this understanding, parents agree to abide by all WIAA and Athletic Coop Team Rules as well as Team Philosophies.

The Boards of Education of Beecher-Dunbar-Pembine and Goodman-Armstrong Creek have the responsibility for crowd control at on-site school-sponsored games/activities/events. This responsibility is delegated to the District Administrators and to their designee(s).

A ticket or invitation is a license to attend a game, not a property right, and thus may be revoked without refund in the event of:

- Disruptive or disorderly behavior;
- Non-compliance with spectator rules of conduct which follow Wisconsin Statute 167, WIAA regulation, and/or school rules related to the game/activity/events;
- Refusal to cooperate and comply with the Crowd Control and/or law enforcement personnel.

Spectator rules of conduct will follow Wisconsin Statute 167 and WIAA regulations. All spectators will conduct themselves in a manner, which does not impede, delay, or otherwise interfere with the orderly progression of the events. Each spectator is expected to:

- Remember that s/he is at a contest to support and cheer for the team and to enjoy the skills and competition; not to intimidate or ridicule the other team and its fans.
- Remember that a ticket to a school athletic event is a privilege to observe the contest, not a license to verbally assault others and be generally obnoxious.
- Learn the rules of the game, so that s/he may understand and appreciate why certain situations take place.
- Show respect for the opposing players, coaches, spectators, and support groups. Treat them as one would treat a guest in his/her own home.
- Refrain from taunting or making any kind of derogatory remarks to opponents during the game, especially comments of ethnic, racial, or sexual nature.
- Respect the integrity and judgement of game officials. Understand that they are doing their best to help promote the student-athlete, and admire their willingness to participate in full view of the public.
- Recognize and show appreciation for an outstanding play by either team.
- Refrain from the use of any controlled substances (alcohol, drugs, etc.) on the site of the event.
- Use only those cheers that support and uplift the teams involved.
- Recognize and complement the efforts of school and league administrators in emphasizing the benefits of educational athletics and the role of good sportsmanship to that end.

In the case of inappropriate behavior, be advised that:

1. Spectators will receive ONE warning only, and if necessary thereafter, be required to leave the store of the contest by management (game officials, administrator, athletic director, law

enforcement, or in their absence, the contest supervisor) if spectator behavior interrupts or adversely affects the normal procedure and progress of a contest. Obscene or loud abusive language directed at participants, players, opponents, coaches, or officials will not be tolerated. If a spectator refuses to leave voluntarily, the contest may be suspended until local law enforcement authorities can be summoned to remove the spectator. No refunds of admission charges will be paid.

2. Students may be subject to suspension or expulsion.
3. The host school shall notify the visiting school District Administrator regarding any spectators who were removed from an athletic co-op event.
