How they work

- Modify adjectives:
 - "The dog was very happy." (Indicates the degree of happiness).
 - The cat is very lazy
 - o That kid is so sad
- Modify adverbs:
 - "She ran extremely quickly." (Indicates the degree of quickness).
 - She thinks very fast
 - She reacts too slow
- Modify verbs:
 - "He almost fell." (Indicates the extent of the action).
 - She quickly fell sleep
 - He quickly finished the food
 - They work very slow


