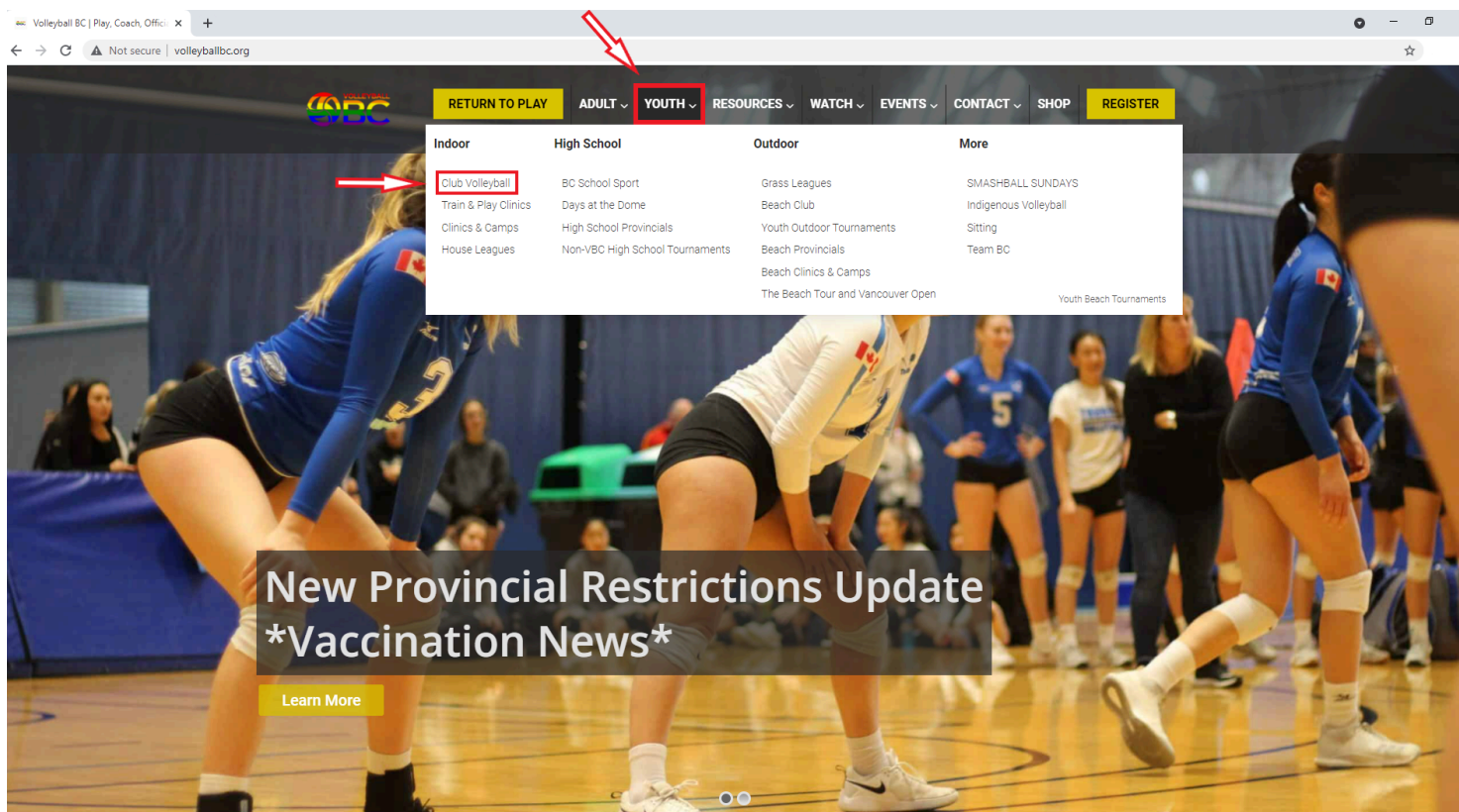

OVERVIEW

This guide is for individuals who are interested in joining club volleyball in British Columbia! Please follow along for a step-by-step guide to how to start and where to look for clubs.

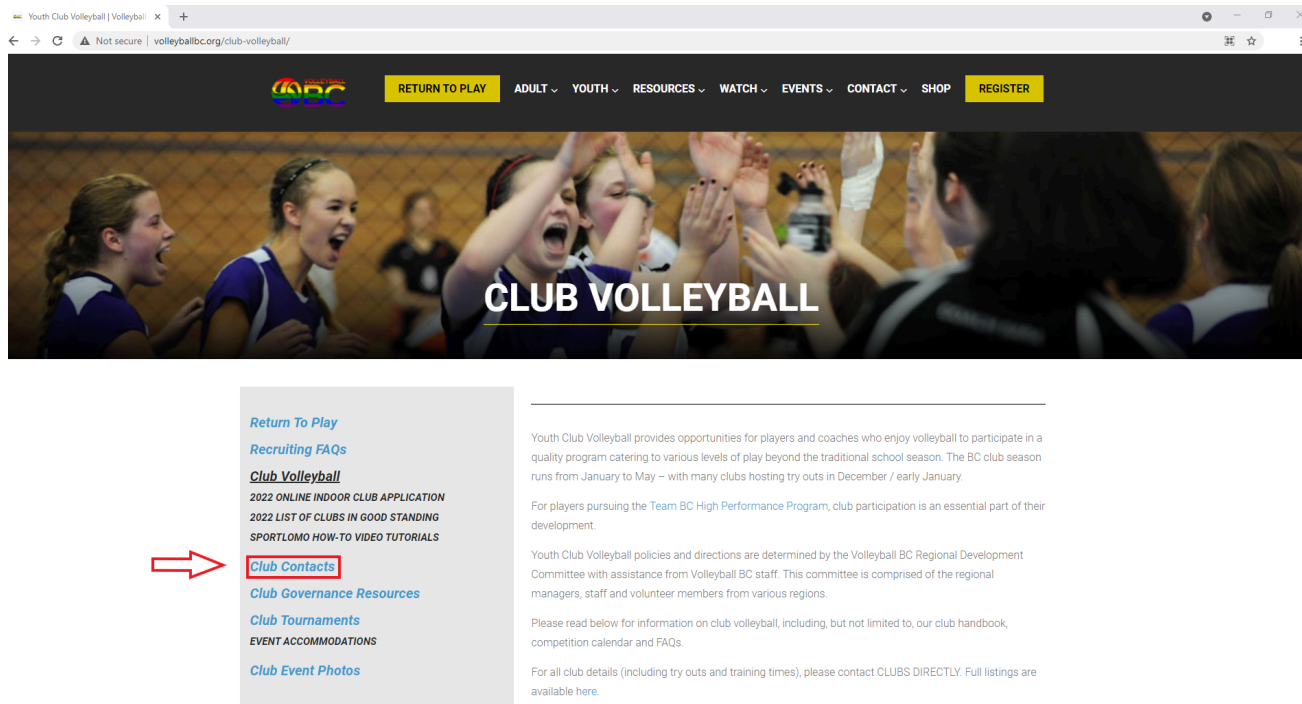
Go to volleyballbc.org and hover over the “Youth” drop down list. Under “Indoor” select “[Club Volleyball](#)”




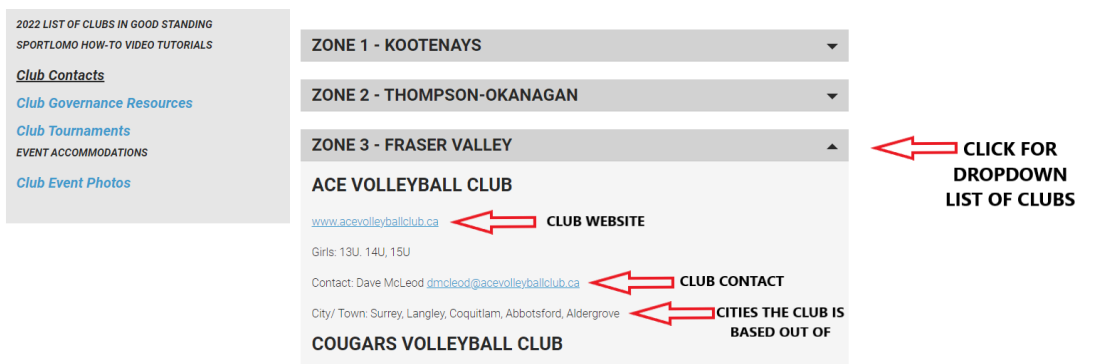

STEP #2 - FIND OUT WHAT REGION YOU'RE IN

From the [Club Volleyball webpage](#) click on the link to the [Club Contacts Page](#)



Find the Zone closest to you (you can play for a club in a Zone that you don't reside in, it just may be further away than a club within your Zone!) Click on the  beside the Zone closest to you; this will give you a list of all of the clubs in your Zone, the city the club is based out of, as well as links to their individual club websites with more information on their club philosophies, and their club contacts to get more information on their club. You can contact a few clubs to get a sense of which one may be right for you.



STEP #3 - TRYOUTS

After looking at the clubs that are close to you, you can attend in-person tryouts. The dates of these tryouts vary depending on age category and club. Please refer to the [Club Contacts Page](#) to find the websites of the clubs you are interested in attending tryouts for and contact the clubs directly for more information. Registration for tryouts is done individually through the clubs and not through Volleyball BC.

Some clubs may choose to not run tryouts, if you have questions about roster spots or team availability please reach out to the clubs directly.

STEP #4A - IF YOU RECEIVE AN OFFER

If you receive an offer from a club and choose to accept it, once you sign the form it is a binding contract for both you and the club to commit to each other for the entirety of one season.

Once you have signed the form you are officially committed to playing club volleyball! Look to your club for the next steps in registering.

STEP #4B - IF YOU DON'T RECEIVE AN OFFER

Unfortunately not everyone will get an offer to play club volleyball. If you did not receive an offer but would like to continue playing volleyball please visit our [Clinics and Camps](#) page on our website to see what your region is offering.

Some clubs also choose to run clinics and camps throughout the year, keep an eye out for those on their pages as well.
