Undergraduate Scholarship 2026

DESCRIPTION

\$1,500 or **\$2,500** for a Colorado high school senior or an undergraduate college student pursuing a degree in education with a focus on Linguistically and Culturally Diverse Education or a degree that advocates for bilingual's access to scientific, medical, technological, or political fields.

ELIGIBILITY

- High school seniors applying to higher education and not yet accepted are eligible to apply. (If selected applicant must provide proof of acceptance to a Colorado institution of higher education before the scholarship money will be awarded.)
- Current undergraduate college students must be enrolled and working towards a degree or certification in linguistically and Culturally Diverse Education in a Colorado college or university or a degree that advocates for bilingual's access to scientific, medical, technological, or political fields.
- Previous winners of CO-CABE Scholarships and who meet the other eligibility requirements are eligible to apply.
- Students receiving full scholarships or grants from other sources are not eligible for this scholarship.
- Candidates must submit all the required application materials prior to the application deadline in order to be considered.
- Candidates who are bilingual and bicultural are encouraged to apply.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

The deadline for scholarship applications is **4 pm, May 8, 2026**. Scholarship recipients will be notified by May 29, 2026.

2026 CO-CABE Undergraduate Scholarship Application Instructions

The scholarship application consists of 4 parts. You must submit all of them for your application to be complete.

- **Part I** is the Information Sheet consisting of 11 questions.

- **Part II** is a separate sheet that lists community service, awards, and recognitions that you have received.
 - The committee is especially interested in your involvement with culturally and linguistically diverse communities.
 - Please provide a list.
- **Part III** is a three-page essay.
 - This essay should be typed, double spaced, 11 pt. font, with half inch margins on all four sides.
 - Read the essay instructions carefully and be sure to respond directly to the questions posed.
 - This essay is a critical piece of your application and is considered heavily by the Scholarship Committee.
- **Part IV** requires 2 signed letters of recommendation.
 - At least one letter of recommendation must be from an educator (teacher, professor, counselor, school administrator, etc. that knows you personally).
 - Letters must be signed, scanned, and sent electronically.

Part III ~ Essay

Part III is an essay (three page maximum). This essay is a critical piece of your application and is considered heavily by the Scholarship Committee. Follow these instructions carefully and completely.

- This essay should be typed, double spaced, 11 pt. font, with half inch margins on all four sides.
- Please include a cover sheet that includes your name and a title for your essay.
- There are 4 questions that you must respond to in your essay.
 - One, how did you come by your language(s)? For this question, provide a language autobiography describing how you have acquired your language(s).
 - Two, why do you believe in Bilingual & Bicultural Education?
 - Three, what influences including people and/or events have led you to seek this degree?
 - Four, what do you plan to do with this education?

Part IV ~ Letters of Recommendation

You must submit 2 signed letters of recommendation.

- At least one letter of recommendation must be from an educator (teacher, professor, counselor, school administrator, etc. that knows you personally).
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
