Superintendent's Report: Meghan Dunn

- Summer Rising 4 buildings open across the district, we were able to get 10 admin at the sites and 1000 students
- PS287 students went Kayaking at Brooklyn Bridge Park and created time capsules
- Arts programming at PS/MS492
- D13 started Summer ahead last year. This year it supported in PS287 & PS93 Focused on 5th grade students.
 - 11 students were reading below school level
 - WIST / TOSWRF program to measure reading growth
 - 8 & 10% growth from students who attended the program
 - Challenge is knowing where the students are coming from because this is for the entire district. Challenge was how to get students to the program.
 - Get parents involved early like in February to get students registered for the Summer ahead program.
 - They looked at 5th graders who scored under 35 percent for the program for intervention.
 - That's the cap from the city of how many students are able to attend.
 - City wide there's 130K spots

- Funding comes from the district budget
- NYC Trust Grant and work with BRIC to offer additional arts programming
- BRIC 266 / 301 Podcast programming at PS 3, PS54 ,PS93, PS256, PS287
- Jamel Gaines Creative Outlet partner schools is MS113, MS691 PS44, PS46, PS67, PS270, PS307
- Goal is to have it in school /School /Principle will work with programs on timing that works best in school or afterschool
- SCA Updates 307 300k for school yard improvements
- 270 375K for outdoor learning spaces.
- D13 Stem Center is almost complete up and running by the middle of September 1 Clinton Ave.
- Prioritizing 4th, 5th and 6th grade looking at transportation there's a day program already set, working on the weekend program
- Working on the after-school program
