because I persevered and kept tweaking the artwork.



The collaborative worker and effective communicator SLO is also another thing that I have often come up with in my art journey. I enjoy doing artist collaborations as it helps me to build my teamwork, as well as relationships in some cases! When I do collaborations, it helps me to think outside the box, but to also work with those I am collabing with to make sure the final piece comes out well! Even projects that do not require active communication still have to do with teamwork- such as the poem/art exchange that my art class did with the modern literature class. Those who wrote the poems needed just enough detail so that the artists could interpret their poems, and vice versa! I think that project definitely had a lot of indirect teamwork at play. I love to listen to other artists (and also non artists~!) about their ideas because it helps me realize that my range in the artistic world goes so much farther than my brain can comprehend sometimes, so I often limit my own creative abilities. However, hearing others and taking inspiration from the media inspires me to come up and really think about my own unique ideas.





For the well rounded and community contributor SLO, I think it really should come naturally to many artists! Art is meant to be used as a medium of expression. One should never enter into the vast universe of art with a closed mind. An artist should always be open minded because you will always stumble upon those who disagree, or see something differently to you. As an artist, I always respect people in their own opinions, especially if they are using their art as a way to express it. When I share my art on any platform, or even just in real life, I hope that I

will be able to inspire others with it no matter if they are an artist or not. I love to get my inspiration from others and I like to think that my art inspires others just the same. An example of this would be my unit 5 project- I created a field guide to creatures of Irish myth. I had drawn the creatures in a style which was inspired by many field guide artists- a style which is not my normality. So, I like to share my art with others, and it helps to get my art out there when art classes have me turn in an artwork for a festival or showing.



Although I've only recently started to take my art seriously and understand what I wanted from it, it has always been a part of my life. I've finally found that I want to be able to share my art with others to help spark their own creativity in themselves.
