

Open Letter Supporting One Member One Vote

To all Australian Greens members,

We will be supporting “one member one vote” in the member ballot running for one month from 13 April, and we urge all members to do the same.

This is one of the first times in our history we have all been asked to vote together as members of the Australian Greens. Each of us will have a direct and equal say over our future, and we believe that principle should be extended.

The Greens were founded on the principle of grassroots democracy. Ours should be the most democratic party in Australia.

How “one member one vote” would work

One Member One Vote does not exclude federal MPs from having a say.

Under One Member One Vote, MPs would have the power to nominate candidates for leader, with each candidate requiring the support of 20% of Party Room. After that every Greens member would get a vote to elect the leader.

Let’s make the Greens bigger and stronger

To beat the big corporations that have captured politics, we need a big, bold grassroots movement, so it’s time to start growing.

Direct elections engage and motivate ordinary party members in long-term strategic discussions about our future. They keep those in the upper echelons of the party accountable to their supporters on the ground. Having a genuine say over the future our party will offer thousands of supporters another great reason to join as members.

Powerful positions should be democratically elected

Members and supporters work hard to get our MPs elected, so it’s important they’re accountable to us. The leader is not just a “coordinator”, they are the public face of the Greens and the figurehead of our movement.

They have a huge influence over which messages and policies the Greens focus on. They decide on portfolio allocations and also have far more staff than other MPs (22 staff compared to 4 for other MPs).

Listen to every member

Democratic elections would encourage leadership candidates to engage with all Greens members across the country and be accountable to all. That includes members in places that are currently without any Greens federal representatives, such as the NT and ACT.

Catch up with other Green parties

The Australian Greens are one of just a few Green parties in the world, and one of the few progressive parties, that does not give members a say in electing our parliamentary leader. It's time to catch up.

The status quo is not working

We cannot support the status quo, which gives just ten people the power to choose who leads our party which had 1.5 million supporters at the last federal election. Leadership elections have been secretive, and force MPs to take sides against each other.

At this moment of unfolding crisis, when so much is up for grabs, we cannot be satisfied with the same outdated system. The Greens must be bolder and we must break past 10% of the nationwide vote. Welcoming new members and new energy is the way forward.

We already know from the survey of all members in November 2019 that just 30% of members support continuing with the status quo.

A Labor-style 50/50 model is a bad idea

We also cannot support a Labor-style 50/50 model. It is risky and wrong in principle.

A 50/50 model would give every MP the same voting power as 1,500 ordinary members.

If the leader is voted in by the Party Room overruling the members, they will struggle to lead and members will feel betrayed and demoralised.

If the members overrule the Party Room, the conservative media will relentlessly sow division and undermine them.

In 2013, Labor members voted for Anthony Albanese, but their MPs overruled them in a factional deal and appointed Bill Shorten. That would be poison for the Greens.

One Member One Vote would discourage closed-door deals, since all candidates would need to make their case to members, not build personal networks of loyalty in Canberra.

Every member matters

We are Greens members new and old from across the country. Some of us are members of Parliament or elected local government councillors. Some of us are current or former office-bearers at federal or State level. We are door-knockers, phone-bankers, how-to-vote volunteers. We are donors, branch members and ordinary people who joined the Greens to do politics differently.

We believe that every member matters. One member, one vote.
