

Opinions Editor

The Dalhousie Gazette Publishing Society is looking to hire an Opinions Editor for the next publishing year (May 1, 2020 to April 30, 2021). The Opinions Editor is responsible for all online and print content in the opinions section.

The responsibilities of the Opinions Editor are, but not limited to:

- 1. Maintaining professional relations within the staff
- 2. Soliciting and creating content for both the online and print edition of *the Dalhousie Gazette* with relevant opinions stories
- 3. Thoroughly fact-checking and copy editing all content for the opinions section
- 4. Recruiting writers for the opinions section; assisting writers to generate pitches, learn skills and to better contribute to the society
- 5. Ensuring copy for the opinions section conforms to deadline and production schedule of the newspaper
- 6. Attending editorial meetings and pitch meetings
- 7. Undergoing staff training

The Opinions Editor is a member of the Gazette's paid staff. They must be available for communication with staff and volunteers on an ongoing basis for 20 hours a week, five of which are required to be present in the office.

The Opinions Editor will be paid \$680 per month (we do not publish in the summer months, so they will not be compensated during those months). These numbers may be subject to change, but are what the business manager has estimated for next year. The successful candidate will be notified if there are any salary changes.

The Opinions Editor must be:

- 1. either a part-time or full-time student at Dalhousie or the University of King's College, and member of its respective student union;
- 2. not a representative on the Dalhousie Student Union Council, Board of Governors or Senate

Potential candidates will be contacted for an interview. A résumé, cover letter and three samples of work must be submitted to the Chair of the Publishing Board, at gazette.board@gmail.com by 5 p.m. on March 27, 2020.
