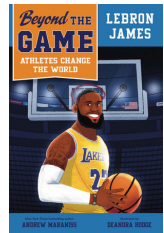
Judy Moody, Girl Detective by Megan McDonald

Before he became one of the most famous basketball players on the planet, before he began speaking out for justice, LeBron James was just a kid.



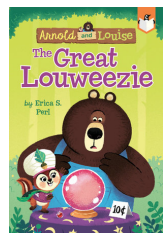
Star Friends: Mirror Magic by Linda Chapman

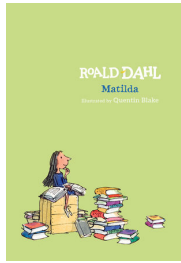
Captain Awesome to the Rescue by Stan Kirby

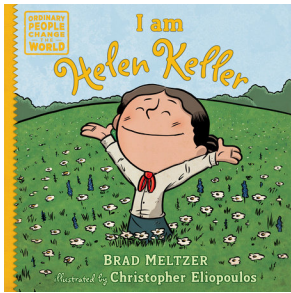
The Great Louweezie by Erica S. Pearl
