SELECTIVE ADMISSIONS

- Mid Michigan College admits students to the Medical Assistant Program under a Selective Admission Process. The criteria for admission will be based on:
 - > Number of credit hours taken at Mid (20% of total)
 - > Previous earned degrees (20% of total)
 - > Previously documented healthcare-related work experience (30% of total)
 - > Personal Statement (30% of total)

APPLYING AND APPLICATIONS

- Admission to the Medical Assistant Program is limited to 30 students each fall.
- Students who are interested in completing the 2-Year Associate in Applied Science for Medical Assisting OR
 the 10-Month Training Credential for Medical Assistant may apply directly to the Medical Assistant Program
 between December and May 1. Equivalent courses from other post-secondary institutions may be used to fulfill
 Medical Assistant Program requirements.
- Students not awarded seats will be placed on an alternate list according to the point system. This list will be used solely for the purpose of filling any vacancies that may arise that year only, and will not carry over to the next year.
- Students who are qualified but not admitted to the program in the fall semester may apply during the next admission cycle.
- Applications are online and are due May 1 annually.
- Letters will be sent to students whether it is an acceptance or denial letter.

PREVIOUSLY EARNED DEGREE

- Only one previously earned degree will be accepted. Documentation, per transcript, MUST be provided when applying, to support an earned degree.
- Students that have submitted an official transcript to Mid when transferring MUST make sure that the Mid Medical Assistant Department also has a copy of the transcript stating proof of the earned degree.

CREDITS AT MID

• Indicate the number of credits successfully completed at Mid ONLY (not transferred in).

PREVIOUS HEALTH CARE EXPERIENCE

- All health care experience MUST be provided with documentation of job description, length of service, and hours per week from supervisor, on agency letterhead, for work/volunteering completed in the past 5 years.
- All direct/indirect care must be for a minimum of 4 months and must be documented as such from the
 employer. All volunteering in a healthcare setting must be for a minimum of 40 hours and must be
 documented by the supervisor.
- Letters of healthcare experience must be included with the application. Completing the Certified Nurse Aide, Phlebotomy or any other training course does not qualify as work experience, with the exception of successful completion of the Public Health Worker program and internship, and will be counted as indirect care.
- Only ONE category will be accepted.

PERSONAL STATEMENT

• This personal statement is part of the selective admission point scale, and therefore, affects your prospects for admission. It is to be typed on a separate sheet of paper and should be a maximum of one page in length. It is

to be attached to the Personal Statement Form, which is included in this packet and on the Mid Medical Assistant website.

 - > significant experiences, activities, and employment.
 - your reasons for considering a career in health science.
 - > how your medical office observation related to your reasons for selecting a career in health science.
 - your plans and aspirations for the future.

DRUG SCREENING & IMMUNIZATIONS

- Drug screenings are mandatory for all Health Sciences programs' students. This is at the students' expense
 and not covered by Mid. Students will receive a packet of information, with instructions, once accepted into
 the program.
- Immunizations are mandatory for all Health Sciences programs' students. This is at the students' expense
 and not covered by Mid. Students will receive a packet of information, with instructions, once accepted into
 the program.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK

- The enactment of the revised Public Health Code effective April 1, 2006, now requires that all healthcare providers have a criminal background check (CBC) that includes an FBI check. Based on this legislation, students' final acceptance into the Medical Assistant program may be affected by the results of this background check. This will be at the students' expense and must be completed prior to the beginning of the semester. The CBC must be current (not older than two years) for the duration of the program. This is at the students' expense and not covered by Mid. Students will receive information once accepted into the program.
- Students should be aware that Mid Michigan College is not responsible if an applicant is denied licensure after completion of the Medical Assistant program.

Completion of BIO 120 must be taken within five years of being accepted into ALH 212. All courses leading to the completion of the Medical Assistant degree must be taken with a minimum grade of C and may be repeated only once, including withdrawals. A cumulative GPA of 2.5 (C+) is required to be eligible to be selected into the MA program classes (ALH 212, ALH 213, ALH 214, ALH 230, and ALH 250).
