A Bill for an Act to limit the percentage of Tollways in our key roads, and for related purposes.

The Parliament of Australia enacts:

Part 1—Preliminary

1 Short title

This Act may be cited as the Tollway Limitation Bill 2021

2 Commencement

(1) Each provision of this Act specified in column 1 of the table commences, or is taken to have commenced, in accordance with column 2 of the table. Any other statement in column 2 has effect according to its terms.

Note:

This table relates only to the provisions of this Act as originally enacted. It will not be amended to deal with any later amendments of this Act.

(2) Any information in column 3 of the table is not part of this Act. Information may be inserted in this column, or information in it may be edited, in any published version of this Act.

3 Commonwealth to be bound

This Act binds the Commonwealth in all its capacities.

4 Extension to external Territories

This Act extends to all external Territories.

5 Extension to the States

This Act is made under section 106A of the Australian Constitution.

6 Definitions

In this Act:

M Road means roads classified with the M Route prefix, eg. the M79 Calder Freeway. Western Australia's National Highways and State Routes 2-8 are M Roads.

A Road means roads classified with the A Route prefix, eg. the A6 Huon Highway. Western Australia's State Routes 10-139 are A Roads.

Tollway means roads classified with the M or A prefix that require a fee to be paid to drive on a specific road. Note - The

State means the geographic area of the each of the seven states of the Commonwealth of Australia

Territory means the geographic area of the Australian Capital Territory

7 Objects of this Act

The objects of this Act are:

- (a) To limit the growing number of tolls on our key roads
- (b) To lower the rising costs of travelling to work for many Australians
- (c) To keep vital Australian infrastructure in government hands

Part 2—Tollway Limitation

8 Tollway Limit on M Routes

Tollways must not make up more than 70% of M Routes in each state or territory

9 Tollway Limit on A Routes

Tollways must not make up more than 50% of A Routes in each state or territory

10A Tollway Definition

A Tollway is a:

- (a) An M or A Route that is privately owned and a fee is charged for its use or;
- (b) publicly owned but leased to a private company that charges a fee for use

10B Tollway Definition, partial tollways

The fee does not have to apply to the entire M or A Route in question for the road to be considered a toll road

11 New Tollways

New tollways projects may not be constructed or approved if they would bring a state or territories over their allowed tollway limit

Part 3—Routing Restrictions

12 Tollway Restrictions

Tollways may not remove their M or A Route prefix if it would remove their designation as a tollway under the Act

13 Routing restrictions

M and A roads that are not tollways must not be added for the primary purpose of reducing the percentage of Tollways in a state or territory

Part 4—Breach of this Act

14 Breach of routing restriction requirement

If a road routing is found to be in breach of Section 13, the road must be rerouted to conform with the section

15 Breach of tollway restriction requirement

If the Tollway percentage in a state is breached then the Commonwealth of Australia through the Minister for Infrastructure and Treasury must take action to bring the percentage into accordance with the Act

16 Actions the Commonwealth may take

The Commonwealth may take the following actions to bring the tollway percentage back to what is permitted by the act (note this is a non-exhaustive list)

- (a) Purchasing the lease of the tollway in question, turning it into a freeway
- (b) Purchasing the lease of another tollway to bring the percentage down
- (c) Purchasing a privately owned Tollway and removing its toll
- (d) Reimburse users of a Tollway so that Tollway becomes a de facto non-tollway until a more permanent solution is found
