Pupil 2: Say if you agree (согласен).

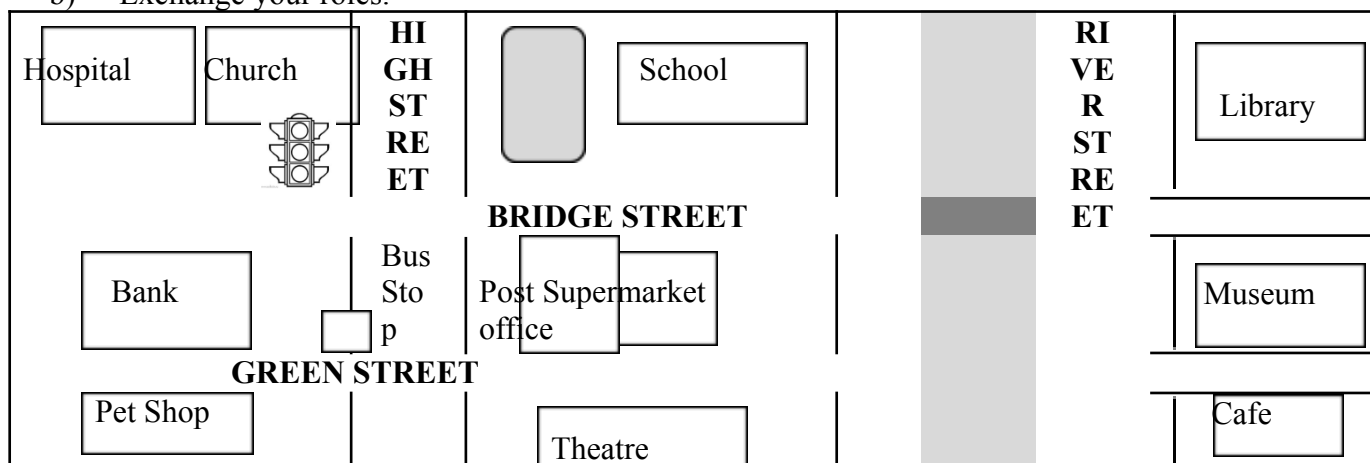
b) Exchange your roles.

b) Exchange your roles.



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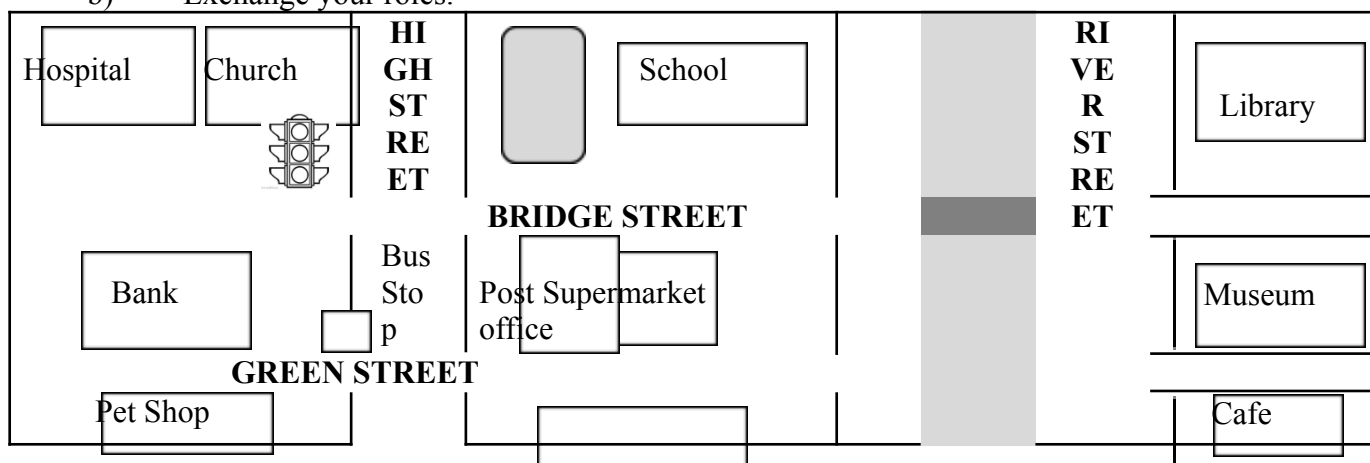
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
