

Northmont Remote Learning Academy Expectations



Below are expectations for the Northmont Remote Learning Academy. These are based on feedback from families, students, teachers, and administrators. As the school year progresses, these are subject to change based on new information, feedback, and other unknown factors that could come into play.

**Students requiring support services, such as an IEP, 504, English Learner, and/or Gifted, will be provided these services. However, the service delivery model will be adjusted based on the remote learning environment. IEP teams will convene to discuss necessary adjustments.

High School Remote Learning Academy Expectations

Instructional Delivery for High School Students

- Remote Learning Teachers will prepare and deliver online instruction for students to be available on an online platform (to be determined closer to the school year)
- Remote Learning Teachers will develop "Playlists" within the online platform.
- Remote learning experiences will be delivered through playlists. A playlist is a sequence of resources and/or activities for students to complete within an assigned period of time.

Expectations for Daily Academic Learning Time for High School Students

- Students will be expected to engage in 50 minutes of *daily* instructional activities for each class. There may be additional expectations for students taking Advanced, AP, or CCP level coursework.
- Teachers will be providing real-time (Google Meets) learning opportunities and independent learning opportunities. Students are expected to attend the Google Meets at the scheduled time. These schedules will be provided by the teacher(s). Policies and procedures will be in place for attendance at these scheduled meetings and work completion just as they would be in a face-to-face classroom.

Online Office Hours for High School Teachers

- Each Remote Learning teacher will set aside office hours and will communicate these hours to the building principal, students, parents, and/or guardians.
- During office hours, the teacher will be available to respond to student/parent/guardian questions and provide support to students individually via Google Meet or another video conferencing or screen sharing app. As always, parents and students can also reach out via email to the teacher if they are unable to meet with the teacher during these hours.
