- C. Michael Borges, Political Manager, CTA.
 - Explained role in CTA. Spoke about school boards and the shift to Gen Election ballots in the even number years. In every single one of these districts, there is a local teachers association that can be doing this work. They are the ones doing the work to push back against these groups.

- D. [agenda accommodation; out-of-order] Lexi Reese Candidate for United States Senate and "doing this for our kids." Housing, homelessness, Black or Brown women have a higher chance of dying when giving birth, behind on technology. Next Gen Equal Rights

 - b) One district printed swastikas and put it on the foreheads of women board members
