2025-2026 • Grades 10 • 1 English credit Year-long Course • Room 104 • Period 3 & 7

Course Description

This course focuses on reading and writing with particular emphasis on critical thinking, listening, and research skills. Students read and analyze literature and discuss the texts in terms of the elements of literature, literary themes, historical significance, and writing styles. Students further develop expository and argumentative writing skills to reach and maintain proficiency in writing. Students are introduced to rhetoric and speech analysis. This course also focuses on grammar and vocabulary development and usage to improve writing. Students also learn multi-step research and documentation skills.

Course Objectives

Students will

- Students will use reading, listening, and viewing strategies to experience, understand, and appreciate literature and culture.
- Students will make abstract connections between their own lives and the characters, events, and circumstances represented in various works.
- Students will write pieces and deliver oral presentations, which are targeted for various audiences.
- Students will enhance their grammar and vocabulary skills.

Expectations

This is a rigorous English class designed to prepare students for college; therefore, the standards for performance are high. Students should be responsible for their own work and have the initiative to achieve with minimal prompting. Students should be independent readers and motivated to succeed. To be successful, students should be disciplined, independent readers who can read and comprehend lengthy, complex works of literature with some teacher support. Students are expected to be prepared to participate actively and cooperatively in each class. They must pass assignments in on time, confer with teachers for help as needed or requested, and take responsibility for their learning.

Accountability & Grading

You are fully responsible for all assignments, instructions, and information presented for class, whether you are present or not. If you are not present, it is your responsibility to communicate with me about the work you missed.

I expect homework to be completed on time. All homework is due at the beginning of class. Homework is given daily and will require about 1 hour of your time per night.

I do not weigh grades. Everything is based on a points system, and I will tell you what every assignment is worth when I assign it, and grades are categorized by Classwork, Homework, Papers, Presentations, Quizzes, Tests, and Projects. Each quarter is worth 25% of your grade. Maine State Learning Results are embedded in each unit but are no longer assessed separately. Grades are updated at least once a week on Tuesday.

WHS incorporates HOW grades. I will assess them twice a quarter. These grades will be no more than 10% of your quarter grade.
