

Trauma Informed Behavior Intervention Flow:

Redirect	Reteach	Reconnect
Restate the expected behavior. Make sure the student knows what is expected and has the right tools for success.	Model what is expected. The student may need to be shown what the expected behavior is or need help getting started.	Engage in a conversation. Assume best intention. Get on the students level. Ask questions first to see how the student is personally doing before addressing the behavior.

1. Verbal Reminder

- Remind the student of the class wide expectation and how he/she/they can find success.
 - i. eg: Right now we are showing respect by using a voice level 0
 while I am teaching. Please face towards me and with a
 voice level 0.

2. Non-Verbal Reminder (if applicable)

a. Walking by to tap their desk, head nod, head shake, a finger to your lips, pointing in the direction they should be looking, giving a specific hand signal redirective, raising an eyebrow, giving a "one minute" finger, ect.

3. 1:1 Check Back

- a. Pause to go talk to the student. Get on their level and next to them to show that you are not asserting your authority over them but instead are engaging in a conversation. *This conversation could take place with them at their desk or out in the hallway together
 - Open by asking a casual question. This can help the student know you are not solely focused on the behavior but on them.

How are you doing? How is your day going? How is class going? Do you know what expectations are for this activity?
