### The founding

The Tokyo Manji Gang was founded in 1976 by Katsu Kane in Tokyo, Japan.

From 1976 - 1980, the TMG was a feared and respected street gang. They earned their respect by being excellent and trusted gunsmiths. On top of this, many people feared the Tokyo Manji Gang due to their side-job being deadly contractors.

After an incident in 1980, over 40% of the TMG was arrested and/or executed. Due to this, the remaining members had fled tokyo in search of a better life. However, the 2 leaders and their trusted capos headed to New York City in search of continuing their legacy.

### The Legacy

The Tokyo Manji Gang was created by Katsune in hope of creating a name for himself in the streets, and to earn respect.

As a child, Katsune's father, Akira, taught him how to handle himself properly around firearms and weapons of the sort. Along with this, he also gained the knowledge of how to craft, dismantle and design guns of his own. Using this knowledge, Katsune created the TMG's own gun store in Tokyo named Bariku Kenjū - which roughly translates to "Horsepower Handguns".

At the age of 17, Katsune was caught in a road crash, which resulted in the death of his father and Katsune being greatly wounded. Due to this, his gun store went out of business due to him not being able to create or sell his weapons for a long period of time.

After the TMG was caught in tokyo and was disbanded, Katsune had made some new friends. One of these friends was named Kirito Piko. Kirito was very knowledgeable and had been around the streets of NYC for quite a long time. He showed Katsune around the city and where to go if he needed help. However, Kirito also worked part-time as a professional assassin for an underground yakuza who's name had never been released to Katsune. Eventually, Katsune asked Kirito if there was any further knowledge that he could share, anything that's less than legal.. That is when Katsune gained the

knowledge of how to be an expert assassin and how to get trusted contracts.
