

Concert Attire

Concert attire is a very important part of the performance; an ensemble is performing the moment they walk into the building (even as you are entering the backstage area). It is vital that we are professional, dress conservatively, and look the part. Members are expected to arrive in full uniform to all concerts, and remain in uniform until they leave the building. Students dressed inappropriately will not be allowed to participate in the performance and will receive a zero for the grade associated with that performance.

There are two “looks” that you can choose from:

- 1. Tuxedo Look:** Black bottoms (dress pants or skirts, and skirts must be below the knee)., white shirt, black jacket, and black bow tie. If you still have an old choral **dress**, you may wear that for this option.
- 2. Concert Black:** Black dress shirt. This can be a button-down collared shirt. Please, no sheer tops or distractions such as sequins. Sleeves must be at least 3/4 length. You may choose to wear a black suit jacket, but this is not required. Black bottoms (dress pants or skirts, and skirts must be below the knee). *If you wear leggings, the shirt must be long.*

For both “looks”: Black dress shoes (no Uggs, sneakers, flip-flops, or extremely high heels) and black dress socks (or tights).

IMPORTANT NOTE: Please wear **BLACK MASKS** for this performance. Reusable black surgical masks are recommended. I will have extras at the performance if needed.
