- Helen - any books by Richard Wagamese - beautiful writing

- Cathie - **I Sang you Down from the Stars** by Tasha Spillett-Sumner- **Untamed** by Glennon Doyle
- Rosemary - **The Henna Artist** by Alka Joshi * - as if you're travelling in India - the sights, sounds, tastes, smells - recommended as a book club - Sequel - **The Secret Keeper of Jaipur** - going to be on netflix; **Eleanor Oliphant is Completely Fine** ; **A Man called Ove** - how your small acts have such a huge rippling effect
- Sue Parry - **Cloud Cuckoo Land** - outstanding - theme of migrants this year - **Exit West** by Mohsin Hamid - love story of people living in a muslim state during a civil war - elements of magic - ; **What Strange Paradise** by Omar Al Akkad - Giller Prize winner - 9 year old Syrian boy - rescued by a teenage girl - great writer; **American Dirt** - Janine Cumins - very controversial - she is not latina, but writing as one
- Theresa - non-fiction, **Better than Before** - self-help - ; **The Lost Daughters of China** - story of the circumstances of adopted children from China

- Pauline - **The Children's Blizzard** * - 2 sisters who were school teachers and how they cared for their students during a blizzard; **The Party Crasher** by Sophie Kinsela - her most recent book - a lighter read; **The Hundred Years of Lenny and Margo** by - relationship between a 17 year old girl and an 83 year old woman - both in palliative care
- Wendy - **Wish you Were Here** - Jodi Piccoult - her latest - set in the time of covid; **The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lax** - Rebecca Skloot non-fiction - and older book that has really stayed with Wendy - highly recommended
- Sue - **Anna, Child of the Poorhouse** by Pat Mestern from Fergus - being made into a movie - historical fiction - sequel - **Rachel's Legacy**; **The Fall of Giants** by Ken Follett - her mom's first book at 84!!
