

United Nations Cocktail Party

Instructions (project): Read your description, do not talk to anyone or share it with anyone from class. In a few moments, we will begin the activity – When I say “GO!” you will go up to somebody, and begin a conversation about your morning. When you hear the bell ring, go talk to somebody new. Remember to act as people from your country would!

You are from Flip-Flop. In your country, it is common to speak in a very loud voice. This shows that you are enjoying a conversation.

You are from Blissland. In your country, it is not polite to make eye contact. Usually, you focus on a person's feet while holding a conversation.

You are from Mongbash. In your country, people speak in whispers. You are a very gentle people.

You are from Praplin. In your country, it is common to hold hands with the person to whom you are speaking. This keeps the person's attention.

You are from Spinoda. In your country, it is common to turn your back to the person to whom you are speaking. Looking at someone's facial features is extremely rude.

You are from Moll. In your country, people stick out their tongues at the end of every sentence that they speak. This adds emphasis to what you are saying.

You are from Trilingham. In your country, you prefer to stand as far as possible from whomever you are talking to (at least three feet).
