<b>Separate Title Page</b> (note: a running head is repeated on every page, but without using “Running head” after the title page)  Page numbers are flush right.	<b>No Title Page</b> ; in the upper left-hand corner of the first page, list your name, instructor's name, course, and the date.  Every page is numbered with last name.

Example:  (Harmon 121).
