

Cami Clune first captured national attention as a *finalist* on Season 19 of NBC's *The Voice*. Her blind audition earned a rare 4-chair turn and a coach block - making her the only contestant that season with those combined accolades. She initially chose **John Legend** as her coach, but ultimately joined **Kelly Clarkson**'s team when Kelly used her only steal for Cami in the knockout round. Kelly later used her sole live show save to advance Cami to the finals.

While Cami is a versatile performer across genres, her original music blends elements of **pop and rock**, with subtle touches of **country**. Drawing inspiration from icons like *Alanis Morissette*, *Ann Wilson*, and *Amy Lee*, she creates a sound that is both nostalgic and modern – resonating with listeners across generations. Cami's background in and passion for musical theatre shape her ability to tell compelling stories through her songs, bringing emotional nuance and authenticity to every performance.

Cami has performed as a featured vocalist with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra and has lent her voice to memorable jingles, including WGRZ's "Glad to Be Here," written by Grabbitz and Robby Takac of the Goo Goo Dolls. She has also performed the national anthem for major organizations, including the NFL and NHL, and proudly serves as the **primary anthem singer** for the *Buffalo Sabres*.

Cami's artistic interests extend beyond music to encompass a passion for *acting*, which she's explored through musical theatre, short films and commercials. Most notably, she played the lead role in an impactful short film "Blink of an Eye," that tackled the sensitive subject of opioid abuse. Her involvement went beyond acting, as she also contributed a dance performance, recorded the title track, and played a role in the film's production.

Cami lives with Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome, a connective tissue disorder that most prominently impacts her joints and digestive system. Despite its challenges, she is an outspoken *advocate* for chronic illness awareness and research. Her philanthropic spirit extends to organizations such as *Variety Club*, *Make a Wish*, *O'Shei Children's Hospital*, and the *SPCA*. Remarkably, at just 8 years old, Cami launched her own organization called Backyard Broadway, using music performances to raise funds for families affected by pediatric cancer and chronic illness. Her commitment to using her voice as a force for positive change remains a core part of who she is.

In 2023, Cami formed **Cami and The Fringe** - a dynamic 5-piece band that brings her music to life with vibrant, high energy performances.

Alongside two studio covers from *The Voice* - "Skinny Love" and "I Put A Spell On You" - Cami released her first two original singles produced by Grabbitz: "old at 20" and "PARASITE." Since then, Cami has been laser-focused on writing and releasing new music. With singles like "Rewind," "Summer Fantasy," "To The Grave," and "Cute" out now, Cami is thrilled to be sharing what she feels is the most authentic and exciting chapter of her artistic evolution.

A proud Buffalo native, Cami Clune remains grounded in her roots, infusing heartfelt storytelling, authenticity, and purpose to every performance. Her journey is just beginning - and she's only getting started.
