## 8th Grade Project Prospectus Submission

As part of the 8th Grade Project, each 8th Grade student is required to submit a Prospectus—a formal proposal outlining their intended project topic. This Prospectus will be due on the first day we return to school. At that time, the 8th Grade advisory team, along with Mr. Walsh, will carefully review each student's proposed idea and provide constructive feedback.

Past experience shows that some students propose projects that are overly ambitious for the time frame, while others may select topics that do not fully explore their potential. More often, proposed topics are well-suited to the project timeline and goals. Our objective is to help students identify the just-right, “Goldilocks” project—one that is appropriately challenging, feasible, and engaging.

With our guidance, students will refine their ideas to ensure a successful and rewarding project experience.
