Course Description:

The purpose of this course is to motivate and encourage students to be competent, confident, and enthusiastic writers, readers, listeners, and speakers. We will discover that language is more than just a tool for communication by exploring together how language, literature, and writing can be understood, interpreted, and appreciated through the eyes of our faith.

Canvas:

 Canvas will be used to track assignments, grades, due dates, class communications, and daily agendas. You should check Canvas regularly for updates and use it to track grades and keep track of assignments. If you miss class, check Canvas—when you are able—to catch up on what you missed.

Grading Policy:

- Homework <u>Family & Student Handbook</u>
- Assessment Students will be assessed through regular quizzes, in-class activities/assignments, and summative assessments (such as essays and projects).
 Students will also receive weekly grades for bellwork (these contain practice and review concepts).

- Missing/Late Work: I do not accept homework through email
 - Late work will result in 10% point reduction per day, up to 50%
 - Late work will be accepted up to 1 week past the due date OR end of unit (whichever comes first).
 - Late work will be accepted for the first semester (quarters 1 & 2); late work WILL
 NOT be accepted in the second semester (quarters 3 & 4).
- Missed work due to absence: Students have the number of days absent plus 1 day to make up missing work. It is the student's responsibility to check Canvas and communicate with Mrs. Loving promptly to make up missed work.

Classroom Rules and Expectations:

- 1. Always show respect for others.
- 2. Contribute positively to the learning environment.
- 3. Be on-time and prepared for each class.

Bellringer: Each class period will begin with a Bellringer. It is expected that all students will be working on their Bellringer as soon as the bell rings.

Homework/Quizzes/Assessments:

Time will be given in class to work on assignments. Remaining work may be completed during study hall or at home as needed.

- All homework and assignments should be neat, completed to the best of your ability, and labeled with your FULL name.
- Homework is due at the beginning of class. If you have questions about the assignment, please ask BEFORE class begins. You are welcome to arrange for extra help during study hall.
- Students will have many opportunities to show what they've learned about a given topic. While students will always be given adequate time to prepare for a test and the majority of quizzes, there may be 'pop' quizzes from time to time.
- If you are absent, it is your responsibility to find out what you've missed (check Canvas first). Send an email or talk to Mrs. Loving in person.
- NOTE: Late work (not due to absence) will result in a loss of **10% point value per day**. Late work must be turned in by 1 week past the due date OR the end of the unit (whichever comes first) to receive points. Past the 1-week (or unit-end) grace period, the assignment will receive a 0 in the gradebook.
