By using everyday tools like a phone, Google Maps, and Google Photos, Robert created a map overlay that showcases real-time rockfalls. His approach not only improves safety but also saves CDOT valuable time and money.

Want to create your own Rock Fall Map? Robert's process is simple and easy to follow:

- 1. Sign in to Google Maps and click "Create a New Map."
- 2. Give your map a name and description.
- 3. If you have data to import, (like a KML file), do so in the Untitled Layer.
- 4. Rename the layer to match the current month and year.
- 5. Begin marking rockfall locations with a photo and description.
- 6. For each new month, add a new layer and repeat the process.

Thanks to Robert Jordan's innovation, teams now have a more efficient and effective way to respond to rockfalls. His work highlights how simple tools can lead to big improvements for CDOT.

Sharpening Safety with Roger Kelly

Roger Kelly out of Region 3 is making a big impact at CDOT through innovative solutions. His ideas are helping folks work safer, faster, and smarter. We're here to give him a well-deserved round of recognition!

One of Roger's innovations addresses a common issue in the field: dull chainsaw blades. A dull blade isn't just inefficient, it's dangerous. To solve this, Roger introduced a precision grinder-guided chain sharpener, which gives old blades new life. This tool extends the lifespan of chainsaw blades, reduces waste, and improves safety for our teams.

Roger also found a clever fix for another tricky task: transferring hydraulic fluid. The original receptacle was awkward and messy, often leading to spills. Roger sourced a 5-gallon bucket and attached a pump to the lid, creating a cleaner, safer, and more efficient way to transfer fluid. This simple setup is now helping crews save time and reduce the risk of spills or injury.

These innovations reflect Roger's dedication to improving safety, and efficiency. We thank Roger for improving the experience for both CDOT employees and the public!

Region 2 Is Raising the Bar!

As we continue moving full speed ahead toward the 2025 Innovations Challenge, we're excited to spotlight the innovations being done in Region 2. From safety upgrades to creative tools that make everyday work easier, Region 2 is proving that even the smallest innovations can make a big impact.

We'd like to recognize two standout submissions from Region 2:

Walter R. Garcia tackled a long-standing safety issue related to climbing on and off flatbed trucks. His innovation? A folding step ladder with handrails that slides out from under the truck's bed and stows away when not in use. This simple yet effective solution significantly reduces the risk of slips, trips, and falls. It also makes it easier for workers to access equipment safely. Meanwhile, Matthew Stearns developed a game changing tool for maintenance crews. This tool is the <u>Trash Picker</u>. Designed to end bending and reduce hand and back strain, this tool allows workers to pick up pieces of trash with ease. It's a great example of how small modifications to our tools can lead to big improvements in efficiency and comfort.
