A planning conversation with a teacher is most effective when:

- 1. You view the teacher as a mindful professional who has expertise to share when you develop an atmosphere of trust.
- 2. You ask questions that seek to explore and understand rather than judge. Instead of looking for opportunities to insert solutions, seek to listen deeply.
- 3. You frame questions in plural forms (e.g., "What are some of your goals...? "What are your hunches...?") rather than presuppose a single answer.
