Article in a specialized reference book/encyclopedia	In person, on paper	"Reference Source," found under the tab "Print or in hand"	The first section of the form is about the article, the second section is about the reference work as a whole Enter a new citation for each new article
Entry from Gale Virtual Reference Library	Database	"Reference Source," found under the "Database" tab--select the option for "Original print information provided"	Or just import it directly from Gale using the "citation tools" button!

Journal article	JSTOR, Academic OneFile, etc	“Journal,” found under the “Database” tab	Or import it directly from Gale or JSTOR! Sometimes these sources import with the journal title in all caps, but you can edit that in Noodletools
Historical Speech/address	Website or book	<p>“Lecture, Speech, or Reading,” found under the “Website” or “Book” tab</p> <p>Once in that form, the box at the top will ask you to click where you found the speech (website, database, etc)</p>	Noodletools has a quirk sends you to the “Live” tab no matter how you entered-- just use the box at the top to navigate to where you found the speech
Historical Photo or Illustration	Website	“Photo or Illustration,” found under the “Website” tab	Do not select the “Born Digital” option unless it was created online
