

TechSmith Camtasia: Importing a Storyline Tab Creation into a Rise Course

Target Audience: Developers looking to import a Storyline slide into a Rise course

Learning Objectives: Upon completion of this training, the learner will be able to import a slide created in Storyline into a Rise course.

General Directions/Comments:

- The left column is the audio script. It will be a conversational tone. The numbers here are video markers to know where to place images-they will not be read aloud.
- The middle column is the on-screen text. Please note any grammatical or spelling errors you see in this column, as this will show to learners.
- The right-hand column contains the images and animations that will occur. The numbers indicate where in the audio narration the image or animation will appear.

Opening/Introduction

Hello! This video tutorial will show you how to take a slide you created in Storyline and embed it into a Rise course. [1] I did this when I needed a 6-tab interaction in a Rise course. To do that in Rise, the learner would need to scroll to get to tabs 5 and 6, as shown here [2]. To avoid that, I decided to create this tab interaction in Storyline [3] and embed it into Rise. And now, I'll show you exactly how to do it!	Embedding a Storyline slide into a Rise Course	Begin with title showing on Intro Screen. [1] Screenshot of 6-tab Rise interaction timed to audio. Directions for video

The first thing you will need to do is open Articulate 360 [1], then launch Rise 360 [2]. Next, choose the course you want to add the slide to and click on it [3]. Once your course opens and you see all your lessons, choose which lesson you'd like to add the slide to, and click "Edit Content" [4] Once the lesson opens, scroll down to find the different block options that are available, and click on the black "All Blocks" option on the left [5]. This will open the "Block Library" on the left, which shows all the block options that are available in Rise. You will need to click on the "Interactive" block [6]. When you do that, all the interactive choices will be available. You will need to scroll down to the very bottom where "Storyline" is and click on it [7]. Click anywhere inside your new block to hide the sidebar menu, then click on "Browse review 360" to find the slide you'd like to embed [8]. Find the slide you'd like to add, and when you hover over it "Select," will appear. [9] Click "Select" and your Storyline slide will be added to your Rise Course! [10] As you can see, the functionality remains, and you can use the interactive tabs just like you would in Storyline!		[1] Arrow points to Articulate 360 icon on desktop timed to audio [2] Arrow points to Rise 360 button timed to audio [3] Spotlight will highlight chosen course on Rise 360 homepage [4] Arrow fades in pointing to "Edit Content" button in "Positive and negative communication" lesson timed to audio [5] Arrow fades in/out pointing to "All Blocks" button timed to audio [6] Arrow fades in/out on "Interactive" choice in the Block Library [7] Arrow fades in/out pointing to "Storyline" option timed to audio [8] Arrow fades in/out pointing to "Browse Review 360" timed to audio [9] Arrow fades in/out pointing to "Select" timed to audio [10] Click on the different tabs to show functionality of the tab interaction

Now, once the slide is in embedded Rise, you are able to further format the Rise block. [11] In the upper right corner of the block, you can click on the “Design” icon to see your options. [12] Under format, you can adjust the padding to small, medium, or large, or you can customize it to something specific if you prefer [13] . At the bottom of the format tab, you can adjust the width of your Storyline slide within the Rise block [14]. The default size is small, but if you click on the dropdown menu, you can adjust it to medium, or full width [15]. You can use the “Preview” option in the top right corner to see what your slide looks like at any time [16], and clicking on “Edit” will return you to the lesson where you can return to change the padding and width if needed [17]. If you click on “Background” [18] in that same window, you can edit the background color of your block by clicking on any of the choices listed. Since Rise saves your work as you go, there is no need to save anything. You can either continue editing your course, or if you are finished you can simply close out by clicking the “x” in the tab you are working on [19]		[11] Highlight Design icon, timed to audio [12] Highlight “Format” [13] Click on each option in padding to show how block changes [14] Arrow fades in/out pointing to “Storyline width” timed to audio [15] Click on each option in Storyline width to show how block changes [16] Arrow fades in/out pointing to “Preview” timed to audio [17] Arrow fades in/out pointing to “Edit” timed to audio [18] Arrow fades in/out pointing to “Background” timed to audio [18] Zoom in to tab timed to audio, fade out after audio completes
