NOTE-TAKING WITH STRUCTURE IN MIND

Readers,

You are taking home a chart to remind you of ways you might take quick, brief, notes as you come to the end of a chunk of text. While you are reading, think about the text's structure and ask yourself, "How can I recognize my notes to mirror the text's structure?".

Perhaps you'll be reading about an environmental disaster and what conservationists are doing to solve the problem. You could, for example, make a T-Chart labeling one side "Problems" and another "Solutions".

Make sure your notes match the structure of what you are learning, so they aren't just one long list of facts. Let the text's structure guide you.

Last but not least, for the last few days the focus of your nonfiction reading has been on books that are easy reads for you. Starting tomorrow, we are going to tackle more challenging texts.

CAUSE AND EFFECT

An action that happens first; the reason something else happens



What happens as a result; the consequence of the first action

Detail about the action; add more details if your text includes them

One result of the action; add more results of the action if your text includes them

PROBLEM AND SOLUTION

A problem
